
Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:

The fishing vessel "I.C.40" owned by J. H. Todd & Sons Ltd. was operated by K. Takamatsu, according to information supplied by J. H. Todd & Sons Ltd.

This vessel operated at Inverness Cannery.

Fishing Licence: 3058

Boat Licence: Prince Rupert 205

Naval Recog. No.: PR.050-0

This vessel was not taken into custody, as it was not Japanese-owned, but was merely operated by the Japanese, who used his own nets.

The JP form reports the following articles surrendered to B. C. Police. These would probably be in the custody of the R.C.M.P.

Shot-gun , double barrel, 12 guage.

We have no record of the fire-arms in R.C.M.P. hands, and no action is being taken in regard to fire-arms for the present.



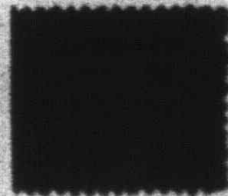
