
Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of May 17th, with reference to certain household effects which you claim left in the protected area.

Your file reveals that you declared no articles left in the protected area. However, we note your husband did declare certain articles with the Custodian. A report of the administration of your husband's file will be forwarded to you as soon as possible.

It is the Custodian's usual procedure to submit any requests for funds, when living in the housing area, to the Department of Labour, and we would refer you to our letter of March 13th which was sent to your husband, in which the Department of Labour stated, "We cannot recommend that this man's funds be forwarded to him as we consider his income sufficient for the support of his family."

You may, however, wish to take this matter up further with your supervisor.
