This file reveals that on June 30, 1943, T. Matsuyama & Co. Ltd. filed claim of \$150.00 against this man. According to notation across the face of the statement of this claim this was written off, apparently by the creditor.

This file reveals that the Department of Labour filed claim for \$80.00 refund of funeral expenses. Cheque for \$50.25, being all the funds in the account of Yosuyemon TAKATA, Deceased, was sent to the Receiver General of Canada on June 26, 1943 to apply on this claim.

No other claims appear on this file.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 23, 1942. He was evacuated on April 21, 1942. He died at Slocan City on May 13, 1945.

In his declaration to the Custodian TAKATA reported ownership of a boat at Oceanic Cannery. As the Custodian has a record of only one boat in which this man had an interest, it is believed that the boat reported was the "Y.T.#1", which was not at Oceanic Cannery, but was among the impounded vessels at New Westminster. As shown by the vessel summary, the "Y.T.#1", damaged in custody, was declared a constructive total loss and the sum of \$195.50 (\$200.00 less Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee charge of \$4.50) was paid to the Custodian on behalf of TAKATA, and credited to the account of TAKATA. This payment was in full settlement of claim for loss of this vessel.

TAKATA reported tools and nets at Oceanic Cannery. It would appear that everything reported by TAKATA was either shipped to him or was purchased from him by The Canadian Fishing Company, with the exception of a box of kitchen utensils and a part set of cork lines. The utensils may possibly have been shipped with other goods. The Canadian Fishing Company reported to TAKATA that they had no record of the part set of cork lines. The total payment by the Canadian Fishing Company for goods purchased from TAKATA was \$99.50, from which was deducted his debit balance at Oceanic Cannery in the amount of \$43.75, leaving \$55.75, which was paid to this office and credited to the account of TAKATA. Details are given in statement of January 18, 1943.

TAKATA reported War Savings Certificate #C325335 for \$25.00; Dominion of Canada Bond H539116, for \$50.00 in his own possession. These were not brought under the control of the Custodian.

TAKATA reported a bank account of \$300.00 in Royal Bank of Canada, 3rd Avenue, Prince Rupert. On March 25, 1947, that bank informed this office that, on September 11, 1942, the balance in this account \$327.65, had been transferred to the Imperial Bank of Canada, Revelstoke. The Imperial Bank, Revelstoke, informed us on April 3, 1947, that no funds remained in the account of Yosouyemon TAKATA, final withdrawal being on August 5, 1943.

On April 14, 1942, this office received from the Canadian Fishing Company Ltd. cheque for \$114.00 payable to this man. This cheque was endorsed and made payable to the payee, and apparently was handed to Yosouyemon TAKATA at Hastings Park.

The sum of \$50.25 was credited to the account of TAKATA with this office in full settlement of his claim for recompense for expenses incurred at the time of the impounding of his vessel "Y.T.#1".

All funds received in behalf of this man were remitted to him, with the exception of the \$50.25, mentioned in preceding paragraph. This sum was paid to the Receiver General on June 26, 1945; to apply on claim for refund of funeral expenses.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

In his declaration to the Custodian, TAKATA reported his tools, net & lines in a general way. On April 14, 1942, the Canadian Fishing Company supplied an inventory of net and lines stored at the owner's risk at Oceanic Cannery. The net and lines were purchased by the Canadian Fishing Company as shown in Statement of Oct. 22/42. The tools, as well as the preserved food and brown sugar were evidently shipped to TAKATA, in accordance with B.C. Security Commission letter of July 8, 1943.

Apparently the only items not accounted for are the box of kitchen utensils (and these might possibly have gone with the other goods shipped in the summer of 1943) and the 1 set of cork line. On January 18, 1943, the Canadian Fishing Company notified TAKATA that they had no record of this part set of cork line.

On AUGUST 6, 1945, Mrs. Arnold, Custodian Agent at Prince Rupert, informed this office that goods left at Oceanic Cannery at that time were worthless and should be regarded as discarded.
