This past year we employed a white woman at our Gulf of Georgia Cannery in Steveston and like a number of other employees she lived in one of the houses on our property.

She was supposed to move out after the plant closed down in the early part of this year but while she kept promising to go she is still there.

It seems that this woman who is a Scotch woman was married to a Japanese by the name of Takeuchi at the end of the last war and he brought her back with him from overseas.

Takeuchi was apparently interned in the Interior of B.C. along with other Japanese but about six weeks ago he landed on the Coast and went to live with his wife in one of the houses on our property and we have been trying to get him out ever since.

You probably appreciate that there is a very strong feeling against all Japanese and the fishermen working at our Gulf of Georgia plant are loud in their protest and insist that this man be removed, and we agree that this is the only proper procedure.

Mr. Eastwood of the B.C. Security Commission is familiar with the case and we understand that he is endeavouring to take some action which will remove this man from our property but we can not continue to carry on and would like to know what action we can take to get him out.

The wife Mrs. Takeuchi was supposed to be paying rent for the small house she was occupying but we have received no rent from her for the past six months and it would be far better for all concerned if your office could have this man and his wife evicted because you can do it far better than we can.
