

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 31, 1942, in which she stated that she owned no property of any kind in the protected area.

On July 29, 1946, the account of this woman was credited with the sum of \$95.05, representing one half of the funds in a joint account, Bank of Montreal, to the credit of this woman and her husband, Shichitaro SUGURO. These funds had been sent to this office by the Bank of Montreal, in preparation for the SUGURO family's departure for Japan.
