PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File 2640

Re: Yasuyuki TAKETA

Reg. No. 10761

This man who was evacuated on October 13th, 1942 signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 28th, 1942. In his declaration he reported Cohoe gear, 5 scale dog-fish gear, two boxes of traps for animals, one box of carpenters and machine tools, all located at Wadhams Cannery, Rivers Inlet, B. C.

Nothing further appears on the file in regard to these chattels and it must be assumed that the owner disposed of these prior to his evacuation or that they were taken with him.

He declared a fishing vessel in custody at Beaver Cannery. This is the vessel described in the Vessel Summary. This vessel was sold for the total sum of \$250.00. Of this sum, the purchasers, B. C. Packers Ltd., held back \$200.00 to satisfy a mortgage on this boat. The Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee who handled the sale of the vessel charged \$5.00 commission and survey costs and on August 19th, 1942 a cheque for \$45.00 was mailed to Yasuyuki TAKETA at Hasting Park. There is no receipt for this money.

A battery radio and loud speaker surrendered by this man were reported to the Custodian by the R.C.M.P. These articles were sold by the Custodian for the net sum of \$1.70 which was credited to his account.

A Victory Bond of \$50.00 value in his own possession was declared. This did not come under the control of this office.

The above summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.

On August 4, 1944, the British Columbia Police, at Ocean Falls, handed to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police the following articles

- (1) 1 Samson Radio No. 4 Battery Set
- (2) 1 Loudspeaker for above (Horn Shaped)

These had been surrendered by Yasuyuki TAKETA.

These articles were listed under RCMP No. 980, and, on August 16, 1944, were handed to the Custodian, who sold them at auction for the total sum of \$2.00. Expenses amounted to 30 cents, and the balance of \$1.70 was credited to the account of Yasuyuki TAKETA.

No appraisal was made of this radio and speaker, but it would appear that the radio was one of those early models with a separate speaker. If this is the case, only the wartime shortage of radios would account for the sale of the radio and speaker at any price.

Dear Sir:

This is to advise that the radio and loudspeaker surrendered by you have been sold. The net proceeds from this sale, in the amount of \$1.70, have been credited to your account with this office.

According to the records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee, your fishing vessel was sold through the Committee for the total sum of \$250.00. From this sum was deducted \$200.00 to satisfy a mortgage held by British Columbia Packers Ltd., and the sum of \$5.00 to cover the Committee's commission and survey charges. The balance of \$45.00 was paid to you by cheque sent to you at Hastings Park, in August, 1942.

The Victory Bond, which you declared, was in your possession at the time of your declaration to the Custodian. This did not come under the control of this office.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and, in order that you may confirm this and send us the receipt given to you at the time you surrendered your radio (in order that we may send you the funds received from the sale of the radio), we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
