PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Naoharu TAMURA, Reg. No. 10934


This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 24, 1942. He was evacuated on June 1, 1942.

In his declaration he reported chattels left under his cabin at Claxton, B.C. Mr. Dave Smith visited Claxton in April, 1942 and inventoried 11 pieces, which were moved to the company house c/o Mr. H. Cowie. 10 of these pieces were shipped to TAMURA on releases of May 19, 1942 and September 18, 1942. The contents of the remaining carton were sold at auction and the net proceeds in the amount of 39 cents were credited to the account of this man.

He reported \$15.00 in War Savings Certificates in his own possession, and a \$1,000.00 endowment policy with the Sun Life Assurance Co. Neither of these items came under the control of this office, but in December, 1943, Sun Life cheque for \$204.77 was forwarded through this office to TAMURA as cash surrender value of his policy.

In reply to your letter of May 13th, we wish to inform you that, according to our records, the only article identified as your property remaining at Glaxton Cannery after shipments of effects had been made to you was one carton.

The contents of this carton were offered for sale at auction, and the net proceeds from the sale of such items as were saleable amounted to 39 cents. This sum has been credited to your account.

Your file shows that the Union Fish Company Ltd. has filed a claim against you for the sum of \$76.79, and we would be pleased to hear from you in regard to this claim.

Dear Sir:

Your letter of July 18th has been received. It is evident that you did not understand our letter of June 7th.

Your file shows that in your declaration to the Custodian on March 24, 1942, you reported parcels of chattels left at Claxton Cannery. The number of parcels reported by you was 16, but in April, 1942, when Custodian representative visited Claxton he was able to find and inventory only 11 items. He did not find the 2 beds, gramophone, 2 boxes of tools, halibut line, Cohoe net and row-boat which you had reported. We assumed that you, like many other Evacuees, had disposed of these items between the time of your declaration and the date on which Custodian representative inventoried your effects. In May and September, 1942, you requested shipment of a sewing machine, 4 boxes of kitchen utensils, 2 baskets, a wash-tub, a crib, a mattress and a can. We understand that shipment was made to you as requested.

The only saleable items, identified as your property found at Claxton Cannery in June, 1945 (when goods at Claxton were removed to Prince Rupert) were a coal basket, clothes line and pails. These were sold for the net sum of 39 cents, which was credited to your account. This money, as you have been advised, has been applied on your indebtedness to the Union Fish Company Ltd.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
