

Dear Sirs:

We enclose statement of the account of Jinnatsu IZUMI as requested in your letter of October 15th, 1945. Mrs. Jinnatsu IZUMI has no account with this office. You will note his balance is just \$520.00, and this is the amount we have to hold as a rehabilitation reserve.

With regard to the nets, we would advise that all nets belonging to the above Japanese were sold for the sum of \$760.21, this amount being credited to the account of Mr. IZUMI.

He has been receiving a maintenance of \$25.00 per month since February of this year until September. In September we were only able to send him the sum of \$15.51 as this was the amount of his credit in excess of the rehabilitation reserve of \$520.00. Trusting this is the information you required, we are,



Your letter of December 20th to Department of
Labour, Japanese Division has been passed to this office for
reply.

When Mrs. Iwami registered with the Custodian
on April 2nd, 1942 she declared she owned no property real or
personal in the protected area of British Columbia. No credits,
therefore, were passed to her account.

When Jinnatsu IZUMI registered with us on
April 4th, 1942 he declared some household effects and these
together with some nets and fishing equipment found by the
Custodian and identified as his were all sold and his account
credited with the nett proceeds of \$779.01. This amount has
already been paid over to him \$163.50 in 1943, \$115.51 in
1945 and the balance of \$520.00 in one payment on November 28,
1947. We know of no further assets belonging to this man and
therefore consider his account closed. He has however lodged
a claim with the Japanese Property Claims Commission. The
claim being against the Dominion Government in the amount of
\$824.79, but the Commissioner is unable to give any indication
concerning the date on which decision will be handed down
in the case of this claim. We are however registering your
request on the file of this man, and if and when any claim
payment is allowed by the Dominion Government we will advise
you before payment to him is made.
