PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Iwakichi TANAKA, Reg. No. 11184

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 24, 1942. He was evacuated on May 17, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a Singer sewing machine and a trunk left with Mr. Perkins, Port Essington. His wife reported that appears to be the same trunk and sewing machine, and also one sack of rice, 8 kitchen utensils and 12 bottles of Japanese sauce, left at the Suddhist Temple, Port Sesington, S. C. A copy of a Release signed by Masse ZAMAKA (apparently the wife of this man) same: for the shipment of 4 items left at the Buddhist femple and the trunk and sewing machine. As there is nothing to show that shipment was not made as requested, and no further inquiries in regard to shattels, it would appear that the items covered by the Release were the items declared by Mr. & Mrs. Iwakichi TAMAKA and that these have all been delivered to them.

This man declared War Savings Certificates valued at \$25.00 on his own person. These did not come under the control of this office.

He reported a Cohoe not and a Spring not left at Port Essington. In June, 1942, he refused an offer of \$40.00 each for these and asked for a price of \$75.00 each. The nots were sold in May, 1943, for the sum of \$40.00 each, and this sum was credited to his account.

The fishing vessel "I.T.3163" (corrying no gashoat licence) was sold through this office for the net sum of \$86.42. As this vessel had been reported to be the property of Iwakichi TANAKA, and as she carried his initials and 1941 fishing licence number, the net proceeds from the sale were credited to his account.

The sum of \$5.00 was credited to the account of Iwakichi TANAKA in full settlement of claim lodged with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for refund of expenses incurred in connection with the impounding of the vessel FI.T. 8.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.



The fishing vessel "I.T.3163", identified as your property, was sold for the not are of \$86.42, and this sum has been credited to your account. Your account has been gredited with the sum of \$5.00 in full settlement of the claim, lodged with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee, for refund of expenses incurred at the time of the impounding of the vessel "1.7." The War Savings Certificates reported by you did not come under the control of this office. Your file shows that Shimo KAMEDA, of Port Essington, filed a claim of \$70.00 against you. If this claim is correct would you kindly authorize payment from your funds with this office.
