

I beg to write to you in behalf of Mr. Yonekichi Tanaka, present address of 735 Powell St., City, had left Inverness Cannery, Skeena River, for Vancouver a little over a month ago.

On his departure there, he have entrusted Mr. A.N. Sinclair, the Cannery Manager, pending decition of his evacuation destination, the following household goods:

- 7 sks rice. 1 closs cut saw. 1 tub sait fish.
- 9 boxes misc.goods (No. 1.2.3. 4. 5. 6. 7. 8. 10)
- 1 sewing machine. 1 grammophone. 1 big trunk
- l carton box (No. 9) 2 rolls linelium
- 5 beds, rails & springs. 4 mattresses.
- 1 washing tub 1 Japanese grip

Now, Mr, Tanaka have applied for Interior Selfsupporting Housing Scheme, which we have promoted under supervision of British Columbia Security Commission, and intending to proceed to the Bridge River District within few weeks.

In connection with above, Mr. Tanaka requested Mr. Sinclair to release and transfer the above mentioned goods to Vancouver.

Yesterday, Mr. Sinclair wrote to Mr. Tanaka that he will gladly release and transfer the said geods if he could obtain consent from Custodian.

The vessel was reported to be the property of Yoshio TANAKA (File 2664) but this man did not declare her to the Custodian.

According to information supplied by J. H. Todd & Sons Ltd. on March 5, 1942, to the JPVDC, this vessel was owned by the company, but operated by Y. Tanaka.

Yoshio TANAKA (File 2664) has filed elaim for \$50.25 expenses incurred in returning home after delivering this vessel to the Fraser River.

The "M.I." was in custody at New Westminster.

Additional Information:

The "Big Bay" was reported to the JFVDC as being the property of Yonekichi TANAKA. Yonekichi TANAKA wrote, "I have sold the boat to J.H. Todd & Sons in 1941." Dear Sir:-

We acknowledge receipt of your letter of sebruary 12th and sympathize with your disappointment at the price for which your radio was sold. We should explain, however, that there is no demaid for a Victor Console set operated by a battery. Everybody now would prefer to use a set operated from the electric mains and the only people who are interested in battery sets are fishermen or farmers in isolated places. Even they, however, would not buy a Console set due to the amount of space this takes up. A mantel battery set would be in more demand and would fatch very nearly as much as your Console did.

Under these circumstances, we think the price at which your set was sold was the best that could be expected. We cannot, of course, secure the return of the set as requested by you, nor, or course, can we send you the \$100.00 you have asked for.

We note that you will not trust the radio or comera receipt to us and this, of course, is entirely for you to decide. Without it, however, we cannot send you either the proceeds of sale of the radio or the camera should you require this latter. We think your distrust is unreasonable since we note that in 1943 your then employer, Mr. Meggitt, sent us the receipt and we returned it to you as shipments were not at that time permitted.

Effects declared as having been left at the Inverses Cannery, all appear to have been shipped to the owner except for two stoves which were probably abandoned. His radio was sold for \$33.67 net, on March 2Ath, 19AA, and subsequent correspondence shows that the Japanese is not satisified with this price.

Reference to letter of May 16th shows that it is not clear whether the transportation claims have been correctly credited between this man's son and himself. They, therefore, consented to the Union Fish claim against the father being peld from their joint credit, and the balance sent to them. This is being done and the camera, being the only remaining asset, has now been shipped so that this file is closed.
