



PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

July 5, 1946.

Re: Shoro TANI, Registration No. 10929

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 23, 1942. He was evacuated on April 21, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a sewing machine, kitchen utensils, 2 kegs of sauce and a wicker clothes basket at Claxton Cannery. There is no disposition shown on the file of the sewing machine but as shipments were made from the canneries without the knowledge of this office we assume this was shipped direct to TANI. The remainder of his chattels were sold at auction and the net proceeds in the amount of \$54.99 were credited to his account. We are remitting this amount to TANI today.

He reported three \$5.00 War Savings Certificates in his own possession. These did not come under the control of this office.

The records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee show that this man was the owner of a vessel "S.T. #1" which was sold and the net proceeds in the amount of \$344.00 were paid to TANI through his attorney, R. YOSHIDA.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.
