GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 2714

Elichi YAMADA, Deceased

Reg. No. 10131

Elichi YAMADA died at Hamilton, Ontario, on February 29, 1944, at the age of 20 years. He is survived by his father, Jinzemon, file #14751; his mother, Shima, file #10868; a brother, Jinsho, file #8155; and a sister, Sokuo, a minor.

Elichi YAMADA was interned in May, 1942, and, at that time, he declared that he had no assets. He was released from the internment camp on November 14, 1942, on condition that he accept employment with C. A. Gardner, Timber Contractor at Gravel, Ontario. At the time of his death, he was employed by Canada Packers Limited, Toronto, Ontario.

The deceased, while employed by the Canada Packers, was insured in a special group insurance operated by Canada Packers Pension Fund Society, and his mother and sister were named as beneficiaries under this insurance. Mr. Wright requested the Public Trustee, Toronto, to administer this estate but was advised by that official that there was, as far as he could ascertain, no estate to administer. Settlement was held up for several months while it was determined who should obtain Ontario and Dominion Succession Duty Releases. Eventually the B. C. Security Commission arranged for Messrs. Daly, Thistle, Judson & McTaggart, Barristers & Solicitors, Toronto, to obtain these releases and, on January 3, 1945, a cheque in the sum of \$1960.00 payable to Shima and Jinzemon Yamada from the Canada Packers Pension Fund Society was forwarded to this office by the above law firm. An order for the Custodian to pay the B. C. Security Commission the sum of \$74.00 to cover hospital, funeral and miscellaneous expenses, signed by the mother, father and sister of the deceased, was received and payment made to the Commission. The balance, \$1885.95, was remitted to Mr. and Mrs. Yamada, jointly.

No claims, other than the claim of the B. C. Security Commission, above mentioned, appear on this file.

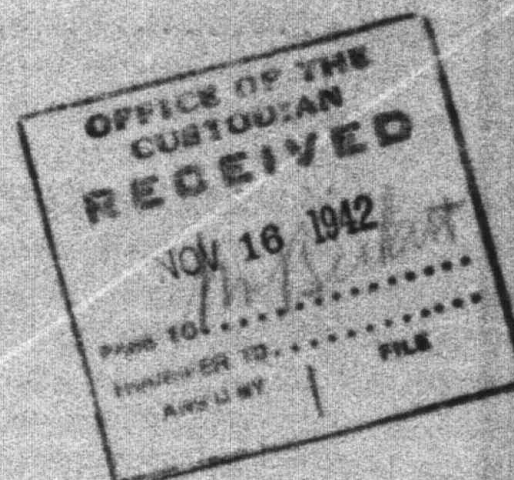

Further to our telephone conversation today we wish to advise that the above named, 20 years of age died at Mountain Sanitorium, Hamilton, on February 29th 1944.

At the time of his illness he was employed by Canada Packers Ltd, St Clair Avenue, Toronto. We have now been informed that he was a member of a special group of employees who paid 60¢ per week for special compensation privileges. An officer of the Canada Packers has advised our Ontario representative that the compensation for YAMADA amounts to \$2000.00.

In view of the fact that the parents of the deceased are on maintenance in our Slocan Project this Commission will be obliged to meet all hospital and burial charges. We therefore ask your good offices in advising the Canada Packers of our interest in this insurance.

The father of the deceased Jinzarmon YAMADA, #04324, a Japanese National resides at Slocan, B. C.

The deceased was employed with us from April
14th, 1943, till October 28th, 1943, at which time he
became ill, and confined to hospital until his death,
on February 29th, 1944. During the time of his illness,
he was paid our weekly Sick Allowance supplied by our
Mutual Benefit Association.

We are advised by the B. C. Security Commission that the above named died at Hamilton, Ontario on February 29th, 1944.

They also advised us that the deceased, at the time of his death, carried Group Life Insurance through your firm amounting to \$2,000.00. Re: Yoshi YAMADA, Deceased.

We are advised by the B. C. Security Commission that the above named Japanese died at Mountain Sanatorium, Hamilton, Ontario, on February 29th, 1944, and we would ask you to kindly take over the administration of his estate.

Information on our file indicates that at the time of his death he was 20 years of age, and is survived by the following members of his immediate family:

Shinemon YAMADA (Father) Sandon, B. C.
Mrs. Shima YAMADA (Mother) Sandon, B. C.
Jinsuke YAMADA (Brother) c/o Princeton Trail Sawmill Ltd.
(age 30 years) 12 Mile Point, Hope, B. C.
Sakiko YAMADA (Sister) Sandon, B. C.
(age 11 years).

We are informed by the Canada Packers Limited, by whom he was employed immediately prior to his death that his estate is entitled to \$2,000.00, derived from Group Life Insurance through the Canada Packers Pension Fund Society, and during the time of his illness he was paid a sick allowance from the Canada Packers Mutual Benefit Association.

We have no information regarding any Bank accounts he may have carried, but do not know his last address and suggest that you communicate with Canada Packers.

We are advised by The B. C. Security Commission, 360 Homer Street, Vancouver, B. C. that they are seeking hospital and burial charges and we wish to obtain reimbursement from the estate for the

Commission. Statements relative to such expenditures will in due course be forwarded to you.

The U. S. Security Commission is paying maintenance for the living expenses of the deceased's father, mother and sister, and in order that we may protect their interest, we would request that you communicate with this office prior to distribution to the heirs.



We are attaching hereto an order in triplicate on the Canada Packers Limited instructing them to pay the life insurance proceeds, the death benefits and the balance of the sick benefits with respect to the above deceased to the Official Custodian. Will you please obtain Mrs. Shima Yamada's signature to the document, also that of Mr. Jinsamon Yamada, Eiichi's father, on his own behalf and of Sakuko Yamada, Eiichi's sister, thereafter returning all signed copies to us.

Re: Hitshi YAMADA, Deceased

I have your letter of June 15th.

In view of the fact that this party was released from the internment camp and was subsequently employed by Canada Packers, I do not think the Custodian should interfere in any way with the administration of his estate but assume that the Public Trustee in Toronto will administer the estate and will recognize the request of the beneficiaries to pay \$200.00 to the British Columbia Security Commission. I think we should stay clear, if possible, of matters of this kind.

I can appreciate that you may consider that while this party was originally interned, possibly in British Columbia, he was also an evacuee but it does not appear that property rights he had in a group insurance could be considered in any sense of the word to be property in the Protected Area because it did not even exist at the time of his internment or evacuation.

Thank you for your letter of the 17th instant.

The B. C. Security Commission reported on this case last April and asked us to protect their interests. We requested the Public Trustee of Ontario to investigate and on the 10th of May, 1944, they reported as follows:

"We have made an investigation of this matter and find that the insurance policy amounting to \$2,000.00, the death benefit amounting to \$100.00 and the balance due on sick benefits amounting to \$47.00 are all payable either to the deceased's mother or to his sister and that none of them can be collected by an Administrator for the purpose of paying debts, etc.

The deceased's employers, Canada Packers, Limited have been instructed to communicate with you as to the handing over of the funds.

It does not appear that there is anything further that we can do but if we can be of assistance in any way please call upon us".

Following this the B. C. Security Commission obtained the direction referred to in our letter to you under date of the 15th instant. We will now have the Commission obtain a similar direction addressed to the Public Trustee of Ontario, and in this way stay clear of the matter as you suggest.



With further reference to your communication of the 15th

We pointed out in our letter to you under date of the 19th
ultimo that the assets did not fall under the Provisions of the Regula-
tions or Orders in Council empowering the Custodian to take over as they
are beyond the Protected Area and did not exist at the time of this man's
internment or evacuation.

We have been endeavouring to assist you in this case with a view
to protecting your account, but under the circumstances we think it would be
advisable for those entitled to obtain the funds from The Canada Packers Limi-
ted, although in order to do so they must first secure releases from both the
Dominion and Provincial Succession Duty Departments.

Canada Packers Limited might be willing to send the cheques pay-
able to the named beneficiaries through you, so that you would have knowledge
of the transfer of funds and be in a position to collect.

We would be glad to hear from you after you have had an oppor-
tunity to give this matter your further consideration.


