GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 2722 Yoshio SHIRAIISHI, Dec'd. Reg. No. 01159

Yoshio SHIRAIISHI drowned in Three Valley Lake on April 15, 1942, at the age of 22 years. He was single and is survived by his father Hideo, file #3556, and his mother, Kiwano, file #1485.

The deceased declared no assets to the Custodian and the only credit that appears in the account of the deceased in this office is for the sum of \$4.29, which amount was received from the Department of Mines and Resources and covered wages earned by Yoshio SHIRAIISHI while he was employed in road work.

A claim for \$40.40 was filed against the Estate of the deceased to cover funeral expenses paid by the B. C. Security Commission in connection with his burial. A cheque for the full credit balance in the account of the deceased in this office, \$4.29, was forwarded to them to apply on their claim.

Claims totalling \$2,497.00 have been filed by the Collector of Institutional Revenue against the father of the deceased for hospitalization in the St. Joseph's Hospital and the Essondale Mental Institute, prior to his coming of age.

This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file.


We note that our Treasury Department has forwarded to you cheque in the amount of \$4.29, in favour of the above deceased.
