

These goods were to be left locked in one room of House #31, Phoenix Cannery, Steveston, B.C., the key was to be left with the manager of the Cannery, Mr. Lord (JP Form)

Also living in House #31, Phoenix Cannery, were Mrs. YAMAMOTO's son, Katsuichi YAMAMOTO, and his wife and four children. Katsuichi declared on his JP Form "personal effects in owner's possession at House No. 31, Phoenix Cannery, Steveston, B.C. The declarant states that he will take his personal effects with him when he is evacuated." In Feb. 7/46 Katsuichi confirmed this statement.

On June 27 and 29, 1942 goods were moved to storage in warehouse No. 3, basement, from the Phoenix Cannery House #31. It was stated by Mr.C.C. Robinson on the Storage list of June 27, 1942 that this house had been broken into. Numerous goods other than those listed in JP form were found in House #31, and were moved to storage. A list of these was sent to Mrs. Haru IAMAMOTO and this was signed and returned by Mr. Heisaburo IAMAMOTO, File #3857, on Dec. 28, 1942.

There is on file an inventory of personal effects, undated, listing goods belonging to Haru YAMAMOTO. This inventory has been used in preparing the chattel schedule for this file, and it is listed under "Undated inventory, Filed Dec. 1942."

Haru YAMAMOTO's goods were sold at public auction and the net proceeds of \$71.24 were credited to her account.

There is no record on file of any other property owned by Mrs. Haru IAMAMOTO.
