PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Sadamichi MAIHARA Reg. No. 10912

This man declared a quantity of furniture, clothing and household effects left at 409 Powell Street. On October 27, 1942 this office informed Maihara that when Custodian representative visited these premises he had been informed that all the chattels belonging to this man had been sold or otherwise disposed of by himself prior to his evacuation. As no reply was received, to this letter, it is assumed that the information given is correct.

In September, 1943, B.C. Packers Ltd. informed us that a spring net belonging to this man was stored in their net loft, but that it was of no value whatsoever. This information was passed on to Maihara and he was asked to write us if he considered his net of any value. We received no reply from him and no further action was taken except to advise B.C. Packers that it would be in order to scrap these nets.

The vessel described in the Vessel Summary was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for the total sum of \$1,100.00. The purchasers held back \$646.40 to satisfy a Mortgage. The sum of \$11.00 was paid to the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee to cover their costs. The balance, \$442.60, was paid to Maihara on March 26, 1942.

This man's account has been credited with the sum of \$50.25 in full settlement of the claim filed by him with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Committee for refund of expenses incurred in delivering the vessel "Miss Nippon" to Naval Service at Steveston in December, 1941.

This man declared a \$5.00 War Savings Certificate in his own possession and a Savings Account in the Royal Bank of Canada, Main and Hastings, in which there was a Credit Balance of \$12.00 at the time of his declaration. Neither of these items came under the control of this office.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

Dear Sir:

As requested by you, we enclose Custodian cheque for the sum of \$50.25, representing all the funds standing to your credit with this office.

These funds were derived from payment by the Dominion Government of \$50.25 in full settlement of the claim filed by you with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for refund of expenses incurred at the time of the impounding of the vessel "Miss Nippon".

According to the records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee the M/V "Miss Nippon" was sold by you through the Committee for the total sum of \$1,100.00. The sum of \$546.40 was held back by the purchaser to satisfy a mortgage. The Committee's supervision charge was \$11.00. The balance of \$442.60 was paid to you on March 26, 1942.

In your declaration to the Custodian, you reported a quantity of chattels left at your former residence in Vancouver. On October 27, 1942, we reported to you that these could not be found at your former residence and that it appeared that you had disposed of these yourself. Since no reply was received from you, it is apparent that you had disposed of all your effects prior to your evacuation.

You declared a War Savings Certificate and a Bank Account. These did not come under the control of this office.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and, in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we are enclosing a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
