

A trunk was shipped to the above on April 19/45 and the cartage and freight charges charges on this in the sum of \$2.98 were deducted from his account. Full details given on Chattel Schedule and Chattel Summary on file. His account was also credited with \$10.00 from Net Suspense Account. See Chattel Summary.

According to information supplied to this office, the above was the registered owner of a fishing vessel the "K.H.", which was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$314.30, which was paid to the above through his Attorney, U. SAKAMOTO, on July 31, 1942.

The above was also the registered owner of a fishing vessel, the "K.H. (1935)". This boat was released to the B. C. Packers Ltd. who held a conditional sales agreement on which a balance of \$530.00 was outstanding. Full details of both these vessels given on Specified Articles Summaries on file.

The ledger shows an entry of July 13/44 in the sum of \$2.77, received from the Imperial Cannery in favour of the above. The file does not reveal what this sum was in payment of.

He asked us to pay all three of these accounts out of his credit with the Custodian. Accordingly the accounts of these three men were credited with the respective amounts on January 18/44 and the account of the above was debited with the total sum of \$229.75. HASHIMOTO was advised on Jan. 24/45 that all claims filed against him had been paid.

On January 29, 1946, Hashimoto wrote to this office stating that he had borrowed \$200.00 from K. Minamide while in Steveston and that he wished us to pay off this debt from his funds. This amount was paid to Minamide on October 4, 1946.

RE: Kichiro HASHIMOTO, Reg. No. 03581

The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on April 13/42 and was evacuated on April 23/42, declared nets and chattels at House #10, Pacific Coast Cannery, Steveston, B.C., as per schedule on file.

The above declared nets to the value of \$1240.10, but did not give us any description of these nets, nor did he reply to our letter of Dec. 2/42 asking for a detailed description of the nets and where they were stored. Nets found at the Pacific Coast Cannery tagged with the name of the above were inventoried by Custodian agent, Mr. C. C. Robinson as shown on net statement of Nov. 24/43. These were sold for the total sum of \$445.00 and this sum credited to the account of HASHIMOTO. This account was also credited with the sum of \$10.00 derived from the sale of new lead line, which had first been put into Suspense Account, but later being identified as belonging to the above, was transferred from Net Suspense to his account. See memo from Mrs. McArthur dated Nov. 30/45, on file.

Chattels found in House #10, Pacific Coast Cannery, were inventoried by Custodian agent, C.C. Robinson, on July 9/42, inventory List #78, and removed to our storage warehouse #2, with the exception of a few articles which were left in this house as being of no saleable value. These have been abandoned. One trunk was shipped to the above on April 19/45, freight bill for same being on file. This was not shipped on a Custodian Release. We received a letter from him dated April 4, 1945, and it was just after this that the trunk was shipped, although in the letter he merely asks if the trunk is sold but does not request shipment. Moving and freight charges on this trunk in the sum of \$2.98 were paid from the account of the above. Chattels, as indicated on chattel schedule, were sold at auction for the net sum of \$78.44, and this sum credited to the account of the above. It is noted that several items which were inventoried are missing. Some of these may have been discarded as having no sale value. Some of them may have been sold and proceeds credited to Chattel Suspense account as unidentified on account of names and tags being lost.

Four cartons with the name of "K. HASHIMOTO" on them were not on the inventory list although they were taken from House #10. When opened up, three of the cartons contained old clothing which was abandoned. One carton contained Festival dolls which have been sold.

This is to advise you that your credit balance with this office is \$303.98. The Treasury Department have been advised of your credit with the Custodian which is subject to the usual arrangements made with regard to such funds, and the Custodian is not now in a position to remit to you.

Your file has been reviewed and it is noted that when you made your declaration to the Custodian on April 13th, 1942, you declared nets and chattels left at House #10, Pacific Coast Cannery, Steveston. Nets found and inventoried by the Custodian were sold for the total sum of \$255.00 and this sum credited to your account.
