Mr. and Mrs. Seiichi TSUMURA lived at House No. 20, Phoenix Cannery. On April 13/42 Mrs. TSUMURA declared chattels as set out on the Chattel Schedule attached.

The chattels from House No. 20 were moved to our auction room by Mr. W. G. Robinson on July 20/42 at Warehouse No. 3. Two iron beds and springs, 1 heater, 1 small cook stove and 6 chairs were left in the house because of their bulk and small value and the lack of storage space in our warehouse at that time.

The goods moved to auction were sold at Steveston auctions Nos. 1 and 32 for the net sum of \$1.30, which amount was credited to the account of the above.

In August, 1945, Mr. Phears, Mr. Peters, Mr. Good, Mr. Harris and Mr. Ross Lord, Manager of the Phoenix Cannery, went to the cannery and inspected all the chattels which had been left in the cannery houses. Their disposition was discussed with the result that the Cannery agreed to pay \$188.00 for all the articles left in these houses that they could use. This sum was paid to the Custodian and is being held in Suspense account for the moment.

A list of the goods removed to our storage warehouse was sent to the above on December 2/42 and confirmed by her on Dec. 10/42 with the additions listed on the chattel schedule. As she does not mention the sewing machine or the gramophone which were on her original declaration, on this additional list, we assume that these were either taken with her at the time of her evacuation or disposed of by her prior to that date.

A custodian release dated Dec. 24/43 was received on Jan. 18/44 requesting shipment of a trunk said to contain picture frame, gill net and records. This was shipped to the above at Whitesmouth, Man. on Feb. 5/44. 1 Kitchen stove asked for on the same custodian release was not shipped with the trunk and on May 6/44, the B.C. Security Commission advised us that the request for this stove had been cancelled.

The above is at Greenwood awaiting repatriation to Japan. The Department of Labour request that her funds be held intact until further advice from them.



CORRECTION OF EAR MARKED PARAGRAPH ON ORIGINAL CHATEL SUMMARY DATED
DECEMBER 15th, 1945

When the Custodian's agent removed the chattels belonging to different Japanese which were housed in the Phoenix Cannery House, certain chattels were left for the convenience of the Phoenix Cannery so that they could carry on operations with white fishermen.

A list was supplied to the writer of the goods that were short after the payment, by the Phoenix Cannery, for stoves which they could use, and for which they paid \$188.00. Mr. Lord, manager of the Phoenix Cannery, was questioned with reference to the shortage and he stated that the balance of the goods that were left, were of no value and were discarded with the knowledge of Mr. Robinson, the Custodian's agent. He then took us, (meaning the men referred to in Mr. Mackenzie's original chattel summary), to a Net House. Stored in one corner were piled many old iron beds, heaters and stoves which were rusted and had holes in them. There were also stoves dumped beside the house which were taken out as of no value. The inspection was really for the purpose of seeing what type of chattels were being discarded as of no value. At that time, we came to the conclusion that the articles which were discarded would be of no saleable value.
