nada by way of Repatriation Grant.





PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 14, 1942.

In this declaration she reported silver-plater, pie plate and pattern casserole, 9 piece dinner set, 2 lanterns, mirror dresser, one bed at House #19 Imperial Cannery, Steveston, and kitchen utensils and wares at Carlisle Cannery, Skeena River. On June 18, 1942 a carton of sundries, a case of glass and a large dresser were removed, in her name, from Imperial Cannery to Warehouse #1, Steveston. On December 11, 1942, Mrs. SASAKI confirmed that the items removed to storage were all the chattels belonging to her remaining in the protected area. Goods sold at auction for Mrs. SASAKI were a dresser and mirror; a Japanese Tea Set; crockery and two lamp shades. The net proceeds were \$20.87, which have been credited to her account.

As shown in the memorandum regarding goods in Steveston storage, a few personal articles identified as the property of this woman were held in storage last October. As the warehouse at Steveston has been broken into since that time, it is not known whether these articles are still in the warehouse. An inventory of goods in Steveston storage will be taken at a later date.

The only other property revealed in this file are the War Savings Stamps to the value of \$2.00 declared by her. These were not brought under the control of this office.
