This man recently received two wooden boxes and one trunk shipped to him from 715 West 7th Avenue, Vancouver. The goods were registered with the Custodian and shipped through the Commission.

He informs us that both boxes and the trunk were broken into, and that from one of the wooden boxes six soup bowls have been removed and the remainder of the contents packed so loosely that in consequence a number of other dishes were broken. The lock of the trunk was broken, and all the good clothing which was stored therein is claimed to be stolen; the only contents of the trunk on arrival were old and patched articles of clothing.

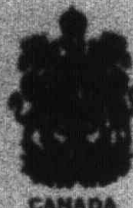
Even in the event that this claim could be substantiated, it is very difficult to see where the responsibility for the state of these goods could be laid, and we are passing this on to you for your information. Perhaps some enquiry could be made as to the apparent state of the boxes and trunk when they were removed from 715 West 7th Avenue.

Since writing the foregoing, we have been informed that the box of tools shipped to Miyo NAKASHIBA, serial #00305, has also arrived in Sandon with the lock broken; so far the consignee is unable to state whether any of the tools are missing.



Yours 3rd complaining of breakage and loss from shipment
of goods made to above from Vancouver, May 14th:

The Custodian writes that TANAKA declared no personal property,
notwithstanding his claim to you that he did do so. Also, his effects were
stored in the Fairview Buddhist Church and not in the Custodian warehouse.
Your Release requested the shipment of two wooden boxes and one trunk, and
same was made accordingly. There was no mention that the goods required re-
packing and no breakage was noticed when our Mr. Morrison, together with
Custodian representative, made the shipment, using a Richmond Transfer truck.
In view of the above, I cannot see that we can do anything further. The
Custodian does not mention that 715 West 7th Ave. had been broken into or
pilfered.

For your information, the cartage companies are so busy and so
short of men that it is very difficult to make these shipments, and it would be
almost impossible to get any information from the cartage company in regard to
the condition of these parcels due to the above and their handling so many
different shipments.

Both the Custodian fieldman and our Mr. Morrison were present
when goods were picked up.

He did subsequently apply for shipment of some effects which were duly identified and shipped to him. He has since complained that the contents were missing but in view of the fact that no declaration of personal property was made and the release form exempts this office from any claim arising from loss in transit, there appear to be no further steps to be taken.

The wife, file 8241, declared a number of household effects left at 715 West 7th Avenue, being the Fairview Buddhist Church. The husband, who declared nothing, applied for shipment of boxes and a trunk from the same place on April 20th, 1943. Shipment of these was made but some of the contents were missing and some broken.

There seems nothing to add at this stage to our letter of June 18th and Mr. M. L. Brown's letter of June 23rd on file 2902. This latter file may, therefore, be regarded as closed and effects declared by the wife followed up on her file only, when time permits, and the state of our storage places permits access to her belongings.
