MEMORANDUM

To: Major McAlister

From: Mr. Green

Re: Heigoro TANABE

Mr. Heigoro Tanabe is down here for a day or two and called on me this morning. You were out but I got the following information from him.

A fire recently destroyed all his jeweler's and watchmaker's equipment upcountry and he is now anxious to obtain possession of a jeweler's cabinet held by us as per memorandum of April 20th, 1944. I asked him about the claims against him and he advised as follows.

(1) Dr. Seldon - \$100.25. He claims that he was making regular payments to Messrs. Woodworth and Woodworth Ltd. against this account and being given receipts which were destroyed in the fire referred to above. He states that some payments were made in watchmaker's services rendered and that the balance should not be more than about \$40.00 which he admits and is willing to pay.

(2) Toronto General Trust Corporation -- \$43.75. This is a claim for rent of 220 Salisbury Dr. which he left about 1937. Towards the end of his tenancy he made arrangements to pay \$15.00 per month instead of the \$20.00 paid previously and received no intimation that the difference was being charged to him. He, therefore, does not admit this claim.

I am of the opinion that subject possibly to what the creditors have to say, his watchmaker's equipment should be shipped to him in order to permit him to support himself and meet the claim he acknowledges.

Re: Heigoro TANABE

Will you kindly arrange for Mr. Wills to look after shipment of a jeweler's cabinet belonging to the above, now stored at, I think, 604 E. Cordova -- see Mr. Wilson's of April 20th, 1944. Mr. Wills looked at this the other day when this Japanese was down here.

We have now received \$15.00, part of which is to pay the freight charges and the balance to apply on his debts. Please keep the packing and freight charges down as low as possible and in any case, not in excess of \$5.00. Please be careful to see that the contents are packed so that they will not shake about.
