GENERAL SUMMARY

File No. 2965

October 6, 1947

Re: Kameo Nobby KUMANO, Reg. No. 03132

This man lived in a rented house at 203 Powell Street. He was evacuated on July 10, 1942. He signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 14, 1942.

In his declaration KUMANO declared the following chattels at 203 Powell Street: Sewing Machine \$250.00; furniture, household effects & kitchen utensils \$700.00. On November 13, 1942, we wrote KUMANO and informed him that Custodian representative had visited 203 Powell but had found nothing there and we assumed that he had disposed of his goods. He replied that he had left at 203 Powell at the time of his evacuation the following:

1 Lamp Stand	3 Tables
3 Cupboards	1 Wooden Box with Goods
10 Chairs	1 6-gallon Jar
	2 Beds & Springs

A memorandum from Mr. Spain, dated December 9, 1942, states that the personal property of KUMANO were undoubtedly removed from 250 Powell Street to 992 Powell with and included on the list of NAKAHAMA, Kimimatsu, File 1126. On May 15, 1944, KUMANO called at 992 Powell and selected a number of articles which he wished shipped to TASHME. On May 22, 1944, there were shipped to K. KUMANO, Tashme, B.C.

This shipment accounted for all but 3 bundles of dolls of the goods which Mrs. Kameo KUMANO, File 11891, had declared to the Custodian on July 27, 1942. Mrs. KUMANO did not leave the protected area until September 9, 1942, and it is possible that she may have disposed of the other articles.

Some festival dolls which were credited to the account of Masaye NAKAHAMA, File 6042, and which had been removed from 250 Powell are believed to be the property of Mrs. KUMANO, and the proceeds of their sale are being transferred to the account of Mrs. KUMANO.

No other property is revealed by this file.

No liabilities are revealed by this file or by the file of Mrs. KUMANO.

This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file.

He called at our warehouse where, in company with our Mr. Wells, he selected a number of articles which he desires shipped to Tashme, B. C.

He left our warehouse with the intention of going to the B. C. Security Commission to arrange shipment, but in view of the latest ruling on the subject, I doubt if the B. C. Security Commission will issue Custodian Releases for such chattels.

In your registration with the Custodian you declared personal property at 203 Powell Street.
