This file reveals UCHIYAMA owned no real property in any protected area of B.C. and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS: UCHIYAMA made his declaration to the Custodian on April 13/42 and was evacuated on April 16/42. He declared chattels as shown on Chattel Schedule on file. No chattels or fishing gear were found in his name. Full details are given on combined schedule and summary on file.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES: The fishing vessel declared by UCHIYAMA was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$96.50 and this sum paid into the Custodian on his behalf. Full details are given on Specified Articles Summary on file.

MONEYS RECEIVABLE: His account has been credited with the sum of \$4.35, being a refund of 1% wage deductions for the first six months of 1941.

VICTORY BOND: He declared a \$50.00 Victory bond in his own possession. This was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

BANK ACCOUNT: He declared a savings account in the Royal Bank of Canada, Marpole Branch, in the sum of \$300.00. This was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

Mr. and Mrs. UCHIYAMA both declared chattels and nets at 8814 Selkirk St., but did not specify that they were in the shed at the back of this address. Mr. Yonesaku FUJIOKA declared chattels and nets in a shed at the back of 8814 Selkirk St. When the goods were moved from this address they were apparently all found with the name and registration number of FUJIOKA.

We wrote to FUJIOKA on Dec. 21/44 indicating that it seemed a Mr. and Mrs. UCHIYAMA had goods stored at this address and enclosed the auction sheets from sale of these goods. A copy of this letter was sent to Mr. UCHIYAMA. Mr. FUJIOKA did not reply to the letter, but Mr. UCHIYAMA did in letter dated Jan. 6/45. In this letter he makes no reference to household goods, but only states that his nets should be at 8814 Selkirk St. It would therefore seem that he may have either sold his household goods or taken them with him at the time of his evacuation.

With regard to the nets, UCHIYAMA in his declaration states that his nets are "Hung". The nets and fishing equipment sold in the name of FUJIOKA were contained in 4 large cases marked with his name. (Fujioke's name)

The above combined Chattel and Summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.

On reviewing your file relative to chattels it has been found that besides the Arimas, Mr. and Mrs. Suski Uchiyama also declared chattels as being left at 8814 Selkirk Street.

When removing the goods from the above address to auction none were found marked with the name Uchiyama, therefore the chattels were sold at public auction in your name and the proceeds credited to your account. Most of the auction sheets covering the goods removed from 8814 Selkirk Street and sold at public auction in your name were forwarded to you on August 24, 1945. If none of the goods sold belonged to the Uchiyamas and in order that the funds from the sale of all chattels may be credited to the correct account, we shall be glad if you will confirm that all the goods shown on the above-mentioned auction sheets (with the exception of those mentioned by your daughter, Aya, in her letter of November 12, 1945 as belonging to the Arimas) were your property.
