This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 13, 1942. On June 1, 1942, he was evacuated. The only personal property declared was the following:

\$50.00 in War Savings Certificates in his own possession. Securities: These did not come under the control of the Custodian.

Life In-Monarch Life Insurance Company Policy #110672. for the sum of \$1,000.00; beneficiary - his father, Kei. Surance: This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

The following were not declared:

Refund of 15 wage deductions for first six months of 1941, Moneys Owing received in this office from Provincial Collector, Vancouver, To Him: and credited to the account of Susumu HOTTA, in the amount of \$3.42. This sum was sent to him on September 24, 1943.

The three cameras dealt with in Specified Articles Memorandum Cameras: were shipped to Susumu HOTTA on June 22, 1945, and the Post Office has been unable to trace the parcel, which was not received by HOTTA. Solden of Library 1. House for the file reveals no other personal property of any kind whatsoever.
