Re: Susumu HOTTA, Reg. No. 08251

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 13, 1942. On June 1, 1942, he was evacuated. The only personal property declared was the following:

Securities: \$50.00 in War Savings Certificates in his own possession. These did not come under the control of the Custodian.

Life Insurance: Monarch Life Insurance Company Policy #110672, for the sum of \$1,000.00; beneficiary - his father, Kei. This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

The following were not declared:

Moneys Owed To Him: Refund of 1½ wage deductions for first six months of 1941, received in this office from Provincial Collector, Vancouver, and credited to the account of Susumu HOTTA, in the amount of \$3.42. This sum was sent to him on September 24, 1943.

Cameras: The three cameras dealt with in Specified Articles Memorandum were shipped to Susumu HOTTA on June 22, 1945, and the Post Office has been unable to trace the parcel, which was not received by HOTTA. *Estimated delivered to Hotta See letter of July 3, 1946.*

This file reveals no other personal property of any kind whatsoever.

The three cameras dealt with in this file were surrendered by Kei HOTTA (File 3365) and have been handled in his file.

In June, 1945, George Takashi HOTTA, brother of Susumu, sent us the receipt for these cameras and funds to cover shipping costs, and asked that these three cameras be shipped to Susumu HOTTA.

The cameras were sent by insured parcel post, but on August 27, 1945, Susumu HOTTA advised that these had not been received. The Post Office have been unable to trace the parcel, and we are to make claim for compensation for the loss.



Dear Sir:

Your file in this office has been reviewed, and it is noted that, in your declaration to the Custodian, dated April 13, 1942, you declared War Savings Certificates to the value of \$50.00 and a life insurance policy, both of which were in your own possession. Neither of these articles came under the control of the Custodian.

The refund of 15 wage deductions, received on your behalf from the Provincial Collector, in the amount of \$3.42, was remitted to you on September 24, 1943.

Three cameras, which had been surrendered by your father, were mailed to you by insured parcel post on June 22, 1945. You reported that these had not been received, and we wrote you further in regard to these on October 11, 1945. It would appear now that these cameras have been delivered to you, and therefore no further action by this office is required.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this unstamped, addressed envelope is enclosed for your convenience in replying.
