### Re: Masajiro HONKAWA, Reg. No. 11013

This man was a fisherman and carpenter living at North Pacific Cannery, Skeens River, B. C. North Pacific Cannery is operated by the Anglo-B. C. Packing Co. Ltd. While at Hastings Park, following his evacuation from North Pacific Cannery, HONKAWA signed a declaration to the Custodian, on May 28, 1942.

In his declaration, HONKAWA reported ownership of the following buildings:

He stated that there was a prospect of renting the above and that Mr. Harris of the North Pacific Cannery would act as his agent. On May 6, 1942, Mr. Harris informed this office that one of the Cannery employees had offered to rent the dwelling and boat shop for \$100.00 a year. On June 16, 1942, Mr. Harris sent to this office \$100.00 in payment of a year's rental from June 1, 1942. On February 6, 1943, Mrs. Arnold, Custodian agent at Prince Rupert, reported that the tenant had offered to purchase the float dwelling house and boat shed for \$300.00. On June 5, 1943, we received \$100.00 covering rent to June 1, 1944. On June 9, 1944, Mrs. Arnold reported that an offer to purchase the Monkawa house at a price of \$375.00 had been received from Anglo-B.C.Packing Co.Ltd. Mr. W. H. Shortridge appraised the buildings early in August, 1944. The appraisal reads:

"Small House 22' x 24', one storey and attic on float. Set up well above high water, looks in fair shape. Contents were all sold by owner before leaving. Roofed with Corr. Galvd. Iron Sheets. Should be worth \$350.00. The adjoining rough shake boat sheds are very slim and doubt if they could be sold as they are apparently on B.A. Cannery property, and I doubt if they could allow tenancy to anyone other than employees."

Mr. Green of this office visited North Pacific Cannery on June 22, 1944. A copy of his report in regard to the buildings reported by Honkawa is filed behind this summary. The offer of Anglo-B. C. Packing Co. Ltd. to purchase at \$375.00 was accepted and this sum was credited to the account of Masajiro HONKAWA on August 18, 1944. Prior to sale the buildings were advertised for sale by tender, but apparently only the one offer was received. No refund of rental was made. It would seem that the purchaser took into consideration the fact that rental to June 1, 1945, had been paid, as there has been no request for any refund.

The chattels reported by Masajiro HONKAWA on May 28, 1942, on August 4,1942, and those requested shipped by him prior to August 4, 1942, are dealt with in detail

in the Chattel Summary. In regard to the goods declared on May 28, 1942, the sink and bath would undoubtedly be fixtures of the building in which these items were, while the other goods would be those referred to in letter of July 30, 1942, from Mr. Harris, of North Pacific, in which it is stated that the company had settled with Honkawa for his lumber and other material before he left the cannery.

In regard to the goods reported on August 4, 1942, most of these are reported to have been shipped to Honkawa. A shipment of goods identified as the property of Honkawa was made to the Custodian from North Pacific on January 31, 1944. Auction sales at Vancouver of goods from this shipment netted \$15.48, which was credited to the account of Masajiro Honkawa. The following goods reported by Honkawa were not listed on the inventory of Honkawa's goods sent to this office on September 19, 1942, by North Pacific Cannery:

It is not quite established in this file that the bundle of window blinds reported by North Pacific Cannery on September 19, 1942, were shipped, as Mr. Rorie says they were and the B. G. Security Commission says they were not. Shipped Nov.13/42-1 Window

HONKAWAA reported \$100.00 in War Savings Certificates in his own possession. He also reported a Manufacturers Life policy. Neither of these items were brought under the control of this office. However, premium payments were made from Honkawa's funds at his request for the years 1943, 1944, 1945 and 1946, as shown by the statement of his account.

HONKAWA sold the vessel "M.H.", Prince Rupert 341, through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee to H. Bell-Irving & Co.Ltd. for the sum of \$309.00. The Committee's charges amounted to \$6.40. The net proceeds of \$383.60, were paid to Honkawa, on May 28, 1942, by the Committee.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$5.00, in full settlement of claim for sefund of expenses incurred at the time of the surrender of his vessel. This claim had been filed with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee. Payment was made to the Custodian by the Dominion Government.

A pair of Field Glasses and Case surrendered to the RCMP by Masajiro HONKAWA were turned over to the Custodian on August 16, 1944, and were placed in storage. These goods were reported to be on hand at the time the goods in storage were placed in the locked storage room at 604 East Cordova last winter. However, these articles were not among the goods brought to this office on July 9, 1947, and it is believed that these have been stolen from the storage room in the period between February 22, 1947 and July 9, 1947.






