PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARYRe: YAMANOBE, Kosaku, Registration No. 00102.

Shizu YAMANOBE, wife of Kosaku, signed a declaration on his behalf on April 10, 1942. On May 23, 1942, he himself signed a declaration and was evacuated on March 4, 1942.

CHATELS: He declared, through his wife, on April 10, 1942 tobacco, confectionery and groceries and house furniture of which he had no inventory. On May 23, 1942 he declared that the business and stock had been sold to Lim Hoy for the sum of \$1,000 which was fully paid up. (Olympia Grocery - 1387 Granville Street.)

In the meantime, our agents, Plummer and Whiting reported on April 15, 1942 that the business was being sold for the sum of \$900.00. He also reported the agreement not very clear on what fixtures actually were included in the deal but stated that both purchaser and vendor understood that it was the intention to include all showcases equipment and the few pieces of furniture on the premises. He also reported a Coca Cola machine on which \$100.00 was still owing. The Original bill of sale was submitted to this office and found to be in order; it covered all fixtures. The purchaser stated that he had assumed contract with the Coca Cola Co.

The file discloses a list of goods stored in the B. C. Purchaser's Warehouse in the name of YAMANOBE, K.. Some of the items were removed on May 22, 1942 and in the absence of any requests from the Japanese, for shipment of his goods, we presume that the rest was also shipped to him, possibly by Messrs. Norris & McLennan, who were in charge of the Warehouse until March 1944.

SPECIFIED

ARTICLES: Kosaku YAMANOBE owned radio R. C. A. Victor, Serial No. 188 which he surrendered to the R. C. M. P. on March 13, 1942. It was handed to the B.C. Security Commission, presumably for shipment to the Japanese, on January 19, 1944.

BONDS &SHARES:

In his declaration of April 10, 1942 he declared one 1941 Victory Bond, of \$50.00 and four \$5.00 War Savings Certificates.

In May, 1942 he declared that he had none but was holding one \$5.00 War Saving Certificate for his daughter Yukie and three \$5.00 War Savings Certificates for his son Yasuaki. None of these were brought under the control of the Custodian..

The file discloses that he is the owner of 10 shares in the B. C. Purchasers Association. Messrs. Norris & McLennan, Attorneys for that company have not yet made any funds available for distribution.

In accordance with the authority given in a letter from the Authorized Deputy of the Secretary of State dated April 13, 1942, to investigate the affairs of Kosaku Yamanobe, of 1387 Granville Street, Vancouver, B. C. I report to you as follows:-

1. That I attended at the above address yesterday. Mr. Yamanobe was of course absent, but I met Mrs. Yamanobe and three Japanese men who were on hand to assist her in supplying information.
2. Mrs. Yamanobe informed me that the business had been sold (subject to approval of the Custodian) as at Friday last, April 10, 1942, to Mrs. Louie Hoy for a consideration of \$900.00, on account of which \$150.00 had been paid. An agreement regarding the sale was produced, of which a copy is attached hereto.
3. The agreement provides for the sale of "Stock in trade and Fixtures". It does not state that showcases and equipment not actually fixtures are included in the deal. Neither is mention made of certain household furniture. The vendor and purchaser both understand however that it is the intention to include all such items. We were also informed that \$100.00 is owing on the Coca Cola Ice case, which the purchaser is apparently assuming. As the rent is only paid to March 31st. the vendor should also pay one third of the April rent.
4. Mrs. Hoy took over the business on the 10th inst.; and as no proper account has been kept of sales made from stock, and as some additions have been made to the stock by Mrs. Hoy, it is not possible to exactly verify the inventory at the time of transfer. An inventory was taken by Mrs. Yamanobe's assistants yesterday, who made allowances for the above variations. A copy of their inventory is attached, which I generally verified by examining the goods on the shelves. The groceries are detailed, but the last five items comprising Magazines, Tobaccos, Drinks, Candies, etc., are bulk estimates, as these

goods are stated to have varied to a large extent. However, the total of the merchandise is acceptable to the purchaser, who had estimated the total value of the merchandise to be \$350.00.

5. Attached hereto is Inventory of Fixtures and Equipment in Yamanobe's store. Mrs. Yamanobe states that there is no liability in connection with any of these items except the Coca Cola case. The value of such articles depends upon whether sold on a seller's or buyer's market. I would consider the equity in the Coca cola case and the value of this and all other items in the list for the purpose of the business to be about \$400.00.
6. Attached hereto is Inventory of Furniture in room at back of Yamanobe's store. Most of these articles are in poor condition and dirty. I would consider \$30.00 a high estimate of value.
7. Another room at the side contained personal effects, said to be the property of the purchaser. Some bedding and small personal effects were reserved by the vendor, who states that your permission is being asked to remove these.
8. A summary of the goods being sold (agreed by vendor and purchaser) is therefore as follows:-

9. Mrs. Yamanobe stated that a white man offered \$750.00. Mrs. Hoy stated that she believed \$900.00 to be more than the value of the items as summarized above, but that she was willing to pay this in order to get the well located store.

AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT made this 10th day of April, 1942, between Mrs. Kosaku Yamanobe, 1387 Granville Street, Vancouver, B. C. hereinafter called the Vendor, of the first part, and Louie Hoy, 232 Union Street, Vancouver, B.C. hereinafter called the Purchaser of the second part.

WHEREAS the said Mrs. Kosaku Yamanobe now carries on business of Olympia Confectionery at 1387 Granville Street, Vancouver, B.C. which premises held by the said Mrs. Kosaku Yamanobe for her husband, Kosaku Yamanobe, who is now evacuated to the interior by the Security Commissioner of Canada and that the said Mrs. Kosaku Yamanobe has registered the said goods and fixtures of the Olympia Confectionery with the Official Custodian of the Secretary of State for Canada.

NOW IT IS AGREED between the parties hereto as follows:

1. The vendor shall sell and the purchaser shall purchase the said stock in trade and fixtures of the said Olympia Confectionery now being in upon and about the said premises number 1387 Granville Street, Vancouver, B.C. in connection with the said business of Olympia Confectionery so carried on thereon as aforesaid.

2. The price to be paid for the said stock in trade and fixtures shall be nine hundred dollars which shall be approved by the Official Custodian for the Dominion Government.

3. The purchaser shall pay to the vendor on signing hereof the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars as deposit and pay the balance of the purchase money as soon as the sale is being approved by the Official Custodian, and in obtaining such consent from the said Official Custodian.

This agreement, and everything herein contained, shall enure to the benefit of and be binding upon the executors, administrators and assigns of the parties hereto, respectively.
