MEMORANDUM TO MR. ALEXANDER

Re: Fumio Kuramoto, No. 00062

I am attaching this party's registration form. You will recall that this deals with the building plant that Mr. Brown visited with the R.C.M.P. constable. Mr. Millerd of Francis Millerd and Company has telephoned me several times asking just what the Custodian's legal rights are. He states that they negotiated three weeks ago to purchase the company's plant and that they actually took possession on the Saturday before Mr. Brown visited same, at which time he states they closed and padlocked the door. Since there was some cleaning up to be done around the place they permitted the Japanese to be there the following week. I do not know whether we had any rights to prevent a removal of equipment, but think it might be advisable to look at it in the wider sense in view of the fact that this party has now registered.

Pursuant to your tentative instructions of the 30th ult. and subsequent authority of the Custodian provided under date of April 2nd, 1942, our representative proceeded to the above premises and obtained information regarding the K.M. Boat Works, at 601 Denman Street and the boarding house at 1701 W. Georgia Street, mentioned in the memorandum of Mr. R. F. Brown, dated March 30th, 1942. The following details are submitted in the order mentioned in your instructions relative to agents' reports:

Real Estate and Personal Property

1. There is no real estate declared in the "JP" form completed by Mr. F. Kuramoto, and we have discovered no further evidence of his ownership of the real estate. The personal property, apart from machinery and equipment used in connection with the boat works, mentioned below, consists generally of household effects located at 1701 W. Georgia St., Vancouver, B.C.
2. We have been unable to substantiate status of title, but understand there are no liabilities registered against the personal property.
3. As indicated above, no land and buildings are reported as being owned by F. Kuramoto.
4. Inventory of household effects at 1701 W. Georgia St., is attached hereto. This includes, separately, those items at the same address said to belong to F. Kuramoto.
5. Particulars of personal insurance are as follows:

Assured: Mrs. Yoshi Kuromato: Prudential Insurance Co. of America, Policy #3950329, Amount \$175.00. Date issued Dec. 11/39. Beneficiary: Roy Kuromato, son, Premium 25¢ weekly. Paid to date.

Assured: Roy Kuromato: Prudential Insurance Co. #M5917291, Amount \$800.00. Date issued December 18/39. Premium \$3.54 monthly. Prem. paid to date. Beneficiary mother, Mrs. Yoshi Kuromato.

6. The personal debts referred to in the form "JP" have been reported by our representative as owing to Mr. E. A. Lucas, Solicitor for Johnston Fishing & Packing Co., New Westminster, B.C., in the amount of \$146.00.

7. It is suggested that the personal effects be left in the premises pending Mrs. Kuramoto's removal and that subsequently they be advertised for sale.

Businesses

1. (a) Wooden boat building plant located at 601 Denman St., Vancouver, B.C., in lane at rear of old skating rink.

(b) Boarding house located at 1701 W. Georgia St., Vancouver, B.C.

The tenants were reported by our representative on the 3rd inst. to be as follows:

2. We were informed that Mr. Kuramoto was the sole proprietor of the boarding house business.

3. There are no books of record available indicating the financial position, but we are advised the following items represent all the business assets. Inventories of the material at the boat works and of the personal effects at the boarding house are attached hereto.

It might be pointed out that the rent under the lease granted by Mr. A. Denton, 601 Denman St., Vancouver, B.C., copy of which is in possession of Mr. F. Millard, cor. Georgia and Bidwell St., Vancouver, is paid at the rate of \$50.00 per month up to March 31st, 1942. There is also a small office building adjoining, not covered by the lease, for which we are informed rental will accrue from the 1st instant at the rate of \$5.00 per month.

4. Fire insurance policies are in possession of Mr. F. Millard, which party has recently been looking after Mr. Kuramoto's affairs. The coverage expiring on November 8, 1942, is as follows:

On supplies, Sentinel Fire Insurance Co.	\$ 200.00
On equipment, Seely & Co. Ltd.,	<u>800.00</u>

5. A list is attached hereto showing items claimed by Messrs. T. Messrs. T. Kimoto, Weston Higbi, and A. Norton. The hull of W. Higbi is completed, and A. Norton is finishing construction of his boat. We understand both parties have settled with Kuramoto for the work previously done.

6. There are no records indicating results of past performance, although the present position indicates the boat plant could be operated with success. We would not suggest, however, that this business is of sufficient size to warrant operations being continued through the offices of the Custodian.

7. We understand that Mr. F. Millard, acting on behalf of Francis Millard Co. Ltd., has been negotiating with F. Kuramoto re purchase of the yard.

Due to the nature of the business, the north end of the building housing the boat ways is necessarily open, which might lead to disappearance of certain items of equipment.


