Some of these chattels were moved from the Vancouver Cannery on Dec. 21/42 by our Steveston agent, Mr. C.C. Robinson as noted on Chattel list #101. On Feb. 22/45 and on June 11/45, all the remaining chattels belonging to the above were moved from the Vancouver Cannery warehouse to our auction room as per lists 1 and K1 on file.

In accordance with your request for remittance of your entire balance with this office, we enclose herewith Custodian cheque in the sum of \$154.42.

Your file has been reviewed and the following is noted. In your declaration to the Custodian of April 2nd, 1942, you declared certain nets, fishing equipment, and chattels left at the Vancouver Cannery at Kburne, B.C.

According to a letter received from your father by this office, on May 4th, 1942, you gave him authority to dispose of some of your property, he being in the protected area after you were evacuated.

The balance of your chattels and fishing gear found at the Cannery and identified as yours, was sold by the Custodian for the total sum of \$154.42, and this amount credited to your account.

According to information supplied to this office, a fishing vessel, the "ANK", registered in your name, was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee on April 2nd, 1942, for the net sum of \$965.00, and this amount paid to you on April 7th, 1942.

You declared a \$50.00 Victory Bond in your own possession. This did not come under the control of the Custodian. You also declared a life insurance policy with the Manufacturers Life Insurance Company in the sum of \$1000.00. This also remained in your own possession and did not come under the control of the Custodian.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheques, we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
