



Limited lodged a claim on August 15th 1942, against the above-mentioned Japanese in the amount of \$74.98, for merchandise supplied prior to evacuation and during the years 1941 and 1942. We wrote Kitaro FUJIOKA regarding this claim but he did not reply and as he had no funds with the Custodian we took no further steps in this connection.

Kitaro FUJIOKA returned to Japan on S. S. General Mcigs, August 2nd 1946.
