Thank you kindly for your letter dated October 10th, 1944 with reference to the above matter.

With reference to what Mrs. Harada had said in her letter to you, I may say that it is incorrect. Possibly she may have forgotten or overlooked certain facts. The truth is, that said Tadao Harada undertook and promised to pay to M. Nishiguchi Company Limited the sum of \$85.00. We have documentary proof in the promissory note dated March 13th, 1942, No. 110, signed by the above Tadao Harada. This sum of \$85.00 was the final amount and that no money was received on account.

I would therefore, appreciate if you would be kind enough and again contact both Tadao Harada and his mother, Mrs. Harada and see if this is correct. And as far as payment of \$5.00 each month is concerned, it seems very small and if they can pay little more, we would appreciate very much.
