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
Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:

We acknowledge with thanks your letter of recent date, and in answer may state that everything recovered from 1019 Auckland Street, New Westminster, was sold in pursuance of the Government's policy of liquidation and the proceeds credited to the accounts of Mr. S.
