



Replying to your undated letter the \$95.00 which you turned over to the Dominion of Canada Finance Department was paid to the Custodian, who in turn paid this to the Dominion of Canada Treasury Department at the time you left for Japan.

The Treasury Department issued to you a draft for \$200.00 and your \$95.00 was applied against this draft and consequently it would appear that you still owe the Dominion Government \$105.00. However, since you left for Japan this office has collected from the B. C. Electric Railway Company the sum of \$3.60, which reduces the above amount to \$101.40.

The records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee show that this man sold the vessel "Marui" through the Committee for the total sum of \$1,100.00. The Committee's supervision charge was \$21.00. The sum of \$583.50 was paid to settle a claim of Vivian Engine Works, and the balance of \$505.50 was paid to Mori MINAMIDE on March 11, 1942.

The sum of \$3.60 was credited to this account as refund of security deposit for light received from the B. C. Electric Railway Company.

The records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee show that the vessel "MARUI" was sold by you for the total sum of \$1,100.00, from this was deducted \$11.00 to cover the Committee's supervision charge, and the sum of \$583.50 to satisfy a claim of the Vivian Engine Works, and the balance of \$505.50 was paid to you on March 11th, 1942.



Dear Sir:

Replying to your letter of 12th instant, we regret that we are unable to pay to Haruo UYEDA, the sum of \$38.99 received as your share of the distribution from the assets of the River Fish Company Limited.

When you returned to Japan on the 17th June, 1946, an advance was made to you by the Dominion Government of Canada in the amount of \$200.00, which amount has since been reduced by \$95.00 - cash turned in before your departure, and \$3.60 - received from the B.C. Electric refund on your security deposit for light. After deducting these amounts you still owe \$101.40 and before any monies can be paid out of your account to you or anyone else, the amount of \$101.40 must be paid off, and we are applying the \$38.99 mentioned above against this amount.
