Dear Sir:

Re the above Japanese whose report we sent in to you on April 24th, we have reviewed the situation as to his property and have now had his furniture stored at the Buddhist Temple, 120 Tenth Street, New Westminster, as it was impossible to protect it where it was located.

Also in the house was furniture and effects belonging to another Japanese named U. Ogura and these were also tagged and have stored at 120-Tenth Street, New Westminster.

We boarded up the place and as it is impossible to rent same we suggest it be left that way.

The Canadian Pacific Railway Company are waiting to hear whether the lease is to be renewed at \$15.00 a year due May 31st. 1942, and that matter I will have to leave to your judgment.

The houses are not fit for white people to live in and I cannot see what revenue the C.P.R. can get from them from anyone else. My own opinion is that now the effects of the Japanese are removed there is no need to renew this lease as the buildings are not worth anything.

"And will, at the expiration or sooner termination of the said term, peaceably surrender and yield up to the said Lessor or its assigns, the premises hereby demised with the right of the Lessee, provided all rent and other charges whatsoever due or payable hereunder have been paid within ten days after such expiration or termination, to remove within the said period of ten days any buildings erected by the Lessee therefrom, provided that the Lessee shall make good all damage to said premises by such removal and provided also that if all rent hereunder is not paid and the said buildings are not removed by the Lessee within the said period of ten days, then the Lessee shall not have the right to remove the said buildings or claim compensation therefor from the Lessor.

"Provided also, and it is hereby agreed and understood, by and between the parties hereto, that this lease and the term hereby created may be terminated at any time by the Lessor or its assigns, on its giving one month's notice to the Lessee, provided that such notice may be given by being posted up in some conspicuous place upon the said premises and need not be specially addressed to anyone".

Rental has been paid up to May 31st. 1943, and taxes up to the end of 1942.

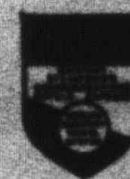

AND WHEREAS it was provided in said lease, that the term thereby granted could be terminated at any time by the Lessor or its Assigns on its giving one month's notice to the Lessee.

**Dear Sir:-**

There are three or four old buildings located on your waterfront property just west of Queen Street, which were formerly occupied by Japanese.

Your Company did not pull these shacks down when the rest of the sheds were taken off the property, owing to the fact they were occupied by Japanese who had no other shelter at that time, and I agreed not to assess them as improvements in the meantime.

For your information would say these buildings are now vacant and in a dilapidated condition, being filled with paper and rubbish in every room, and constituting a bad fire hazard. In view of the above, I would ask you to endeavour to make arrangements to have them removed, as your Company evidently do not carry them on its books as an asset, and it would make a good cleanup of the waterfront.

Thanking you in advance for your kind co-operation.

Dear Sir:-

Further to my letter of January 6th in connection with lease at Port Moody in favor of Sadaki Shimoda.

Our Officers have now made a further inspection of these buildings, and advise that they will have no salvage value, as it will be necessary to demolish them by burning.

I am further advised that the situation around this property is getting steadily worse, as the planking in front and between the houses is badly rotted, and a source of imminent danger.

Under the circumstances these houses should be destroyed immediately, and I shall be glad if you will arrange for the removal, as quickly as possible, of the household goods which you advised me were stored in same. One house is locked with a padlock and is apparently the one with the effects in it; one other house is well nailed up, but the third house, which was nailed up, has been broken into, although as far as our men could see nothing has been stolen.

Will you kindly let me hear from you quickly as our Officers report that the condition of these buildings is "terrible".

Dear Sir:-

Referring to your letter of February 26th in connection with buildings at Port Moody formerly occupied by Sadaki Shimoda.

Originally Shimoda purchased four buildings from this Company which were standing side by side on the property which he leased. Only three of these remain and a gap where apparently one building formerly stood but has since been destroyed.

I regret that we cannot give you any information regarding the purpose for which these buildings were used, nor is there anyone from whom this information can be secured; we are not in possession of information as to what disposition this man made of the buildings which he purchased.

As soon as we hear that the furniture has been removed by Messrs. Coulthard and Sutherland, we shall undertake the destruction of the buildings mentioned, advising you the cost of so doing.


