CHATELS:

When Mr. SHIMODA registered with the Custodian on April 13/42 he signed a yellow "no property" card stating that he had no property of any kind whatsoever in any protected area of British Columbia. When Mrs. SHIMODA made her declaration to the Custodian she declared chattels as set out on the Chattel Schedule on file, at 409 Alexander St. When Custodian agents called at this address nothing was found and Mrs. SHIMODA was accordingly advised on Oct. 13/42. Although Mr. SHIMODA had declared nothing he sent Custodian release for shipment of the following:

1 Trunk with cover containing clothing (tied up)
One box nailed up containing kitchen utensils
One Singer sewing machine
Two tins containing foodstuffs (tied up)
One large paper box containing kitchen utensils
One small paper box containing kitchen utensils
One kori basket containing clothing

On this release he stated these goods had been originally at 409 Alexander St. but had been moved to the basement of FUKUSHIMA'S house at Sea Island. Shipment of all these goods with the exception of one box nailed up containing kitchen utensils and the two tins of foodstuffs, was made to SHIMODA on June 11/43. These items not shipped could not be found. Goods in the basement of FUKUSHIMA'S house had been inventoried by Messrs. H. J. Logan and J. F. Trumbull prior to the date of the above mentioned shipment and a list of this inventory was sent to SHIMODA on Nov. 25/42 which was sent back signed by both Mr. and Mrs. SHIMODA as representing all their chattels in the protected area.

It will be noted from the chattel schedule on file that the shelves, stove, chairs and small table, declared by Mrs. SHIMODA were not found by the Custodian. The goods that were found were shipped as stated above, the foodstuffs and the box of kitchen utensils were missing, and one double bed and spring was sold at auction for the net sum of \$7.60 and this amount was credited to the account of Zensaburo SHIMODA.

The file reveals neither of the above owned any specified articles.

d. The file of Mr. SHIMODA was credited with the sum of \$17.35 being a refund of income tax for the year 1942. The total sum standing to the credit of Mr. SHIMODA is being remitted to his widow with the permission of the Dept. of Labour in their letter of Aug. 2/46 on the file of Mr. SHIMODA, that dept having withdrawn its funeral claim of \$80. No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on these files.



Zensaburo SHIMODA died at Slocan, B. C. on November 26, 1943. He is survived by his widow, Kiku, file #2786 and one son, Yukio, file #2788.

The deceased declared no assets to the Custodian but a few personal effects and household goods belonging to him were found, as shown on the Personal Property Summary and Chattel Schedule attached. Most of these articles were shipped to the deceased, at his request. One double bed and spring were sold at auction for a net amount of \$7.60. A further credit was received for the account of the deceased from the Inspector of Income Tax amounting to \$17.35, being refund of Income Tax for 1942.

The only claim appearing on this file is for the sum of \$80.00 to cover funeral expenses paid by the Department of Labour. This claim was withdrawn in their letter of August 2, 1946, in order that the credit balance in the account of the deceased, \$24.95, might be remitted to the widow. A cheque for this sum was, accordingly, sent to the widow on August 6, 1946 and receipt was acknowledged by her on August 20, 1946.

Dear Madam:

We enclose herewith Custodian cheque in the sum of \$21.95,
being the entire balance standing to the credit of your late husband.

Your file has been reviewed in conjunction with the file of
your late husband, and the following is noted. When you made your de-
claration to the Custodian on April 13th, 1943, you declared chattels at
409 Alexander Street, Vancouver. Mr. SHIMODA declared no chattels what-
soever. When our representatives called at 409 Alexander Street, they
were unable to find any chattels which could be identified as belonging
to you. You were advised of this in our letter of October 13th, 1943.
Although Mr. SHIMODA had declared no chattels, goods which appeared to
belong to him were found by our Custodian agent when they were removing
the chattels from the house of Mr. FUKUSHIMA on Sea Island on November 27th,
1942. A list of these goods was sent to him on that date, and this list
was confirmed by both of you.

We received a Custodian Release from your husband dated March 1st,
1943, requesting shipment of certain chattels found at the home of Mr.
FUKUSHIMA. This shipment was made to you on June 11th, 1943. Goods not
included in this shipment were sold at auction for the net sum of \$7.60 and
this sum was credited to the account of Mr. SHIMODA.

The account of Mr. SHIMODA was also credited with the sum of \$17.35
(being a refund of income tax for the year 1942).

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of
every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian,
and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we are
enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for convenience in replying.
