MEMORANDUM

TO: MR. P. G. SHEARS

FROM: MR. K. V. WRIGHT

Re: P/W A-392, HISUZAKI, Yoshie,  
Life Insurance.

Mr. G. W. McPherson made some arrangement with the Canadian Life Officers Association whereby life insurance policies of the Japanese are held in suspense and in many cases premiums accumulate but under the regulations they are not cancelled. If any funds are available, the Custodian, at the request of the internee, pays the premium.

A letter dated 19th instant has been received from the Mutual Life Assurance Company of Canada as follows:

"From your reply of the 4th instant I observe that the assured has been interned and that his insurance policy is therefore vested in the Custodian.

We do not know of any arrangement under which policies of this kind are to be held in suspense and the premiums allowed to accumulate without the policy being cancelled. Following your reply I communicated with the Canadian Life Insurance Officers Association in Toronto.

I am now informed that there is no definite arrangement in effect. This subject has been a matter of discussion with Mr. G. W. McPherson, but no real progress has as yet been made. As a matter of fact the suggested procedure is not generally approved by the insurance companies. If funds are to be made available for this purpose, it would seem to me that such funds should be used in payment of the required premiums within the usual days of grace."

Will you be kind enough to pass this along to Mr. McPherson for further instructions.


