PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: (Miss) Kikue NISHIMURA, Reg. No. 15506

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 11, 1942, in which she reported no property of any kind in the protected area.

However, on April 13, 1942, she requested shipment of 4 pieces of effects left at Port Alberni. Lacking evidence to the contrary we assume that these were shipped.

There appears correspondence on this file regarding a sewing machine and bebbins. This should be on the file of her father, File No. 12119, for whom she wrote letters.

The account of this woman was credited with the sum of \$43.29 which was transferred from the joint account of her father and brother at the request of her father. This amount represented half the amount of the net proceeds of the sale of a radio belonging to her brother and father. This was remitted to her on June 27, 1945.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.
