#### PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

#### Re: KATOAKA, Kichitaro - Reg. No. 06599.

The above signed a declaration to the Custodian to the effect that he had no property, on April 13, 1942 and was evacuated on September 4, 1942.

CHATTELS: Kichitero KATAOKA did not declare any chattels. However, when the effects were removed from the Great Northern Cannery, Sherman, to 604 East Cordova on December 2, 1942 a few effects marked KATAOKA were inventoried under No. 303. Two other inventories were taken and the three inventories were sent to all the Japanese known to have stored goods at the Cannery. KATAOKA acknowledged the goods marked with his name and also claimed 1 large box of chinaware, kitchenware and miscellaneous and 3 crocks. His son, Hiroshi who had declared one box of carpenter's tools and personal effects and later signed a letter to the effect that he had disposed of them also signed for the same things and the inventory was placed on his file. However, in view of the fact that he had indicated that he had nothing left and that he was unmarried, the proceedsof sale of chattels has been transferred to the father's file. Some of the tools in the bundle have not been accounted for.

One large box of chineware and kitchenware has been transferred from File 2405 who did not declare any such articles. Of the three crocks declared two have not been accounted for and the third was discarded as it was broken.

The total proceeds from sale of chattels amounting to \$15.03 are being sent to the Japanese.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.
