GENERAL SUMMARY

August 16, 1946.

Re: Gakuto HAYAMI, Reg. No. 02137

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 11, 1942 in which he reported that he owned no property of any kind in the protected area. He was interned on June 22, 1942 and released on May 15, 1943.

In a statement of assets completed at the time of his internment he reported a \$5.00 War Savings Certificate in the possession of his wife. This was turned over to this office and returned to HAYAMI on June 21, 1943 after his release.

The R.C.M.P. notified us that this man had surrendered a Kodak camera which was released to the B. C. Security Commission on April 19, 1944 for shipment to HAYAMI.

He wrote requesting shipment of 2 radios which he claims had been surrendered by his brother. We could find no record of radios fitting the description he sent in and no further action has been taken.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

Howe Sound Fisheries Ltd. filed a claim for \$775.03 against this man. HAYAMI denied this claim and we referred his reply to Howe Sound Fisheries and received no reply from them. We are taking no further action on this claim.

This file reveals no other liabilities of any kind.

I have been writing to R. L. M. P. at

Dear Sir:

In reply to your letter of April 6th, regarding the radios surrendered by you, we wish to advise that the Victor-Mantel Combination and the De Forrest Crossley Battery Consol were sold, as shown in the attached statement. The net proceeds of this sale amounting to \$43.21 will be placed to the credit of the owner when the receipts, given by the police when the radios were surrendered, are in our hands.

The Westinghouse radio was sold for the net sum of \$17.44. This sum also will be placed to the owner's credit when the receipt from the police is received in this office. These receipts are required as evidence of the ownership of the radios.

We have no record of the General Electric Model Table Style Phono-Radio, which you report was surrendered by you on behalf of your brother, Gakuto. If you will give us further information, we will try to trace this. We might point out that neither yourself nor your brother declared ownership of these radios, or any other property, when you registered with the Custodian.

We are not sure from your letter whether you have lost all the radio receipts or if you have lost only the receipt for the General Electric radio. If you have the other receipts and wish the radio money credited to your account, send us the receipts. If you do not wish to claim the money at this time, and wish to retain the receipts, we suggest that you keep the receipts in some reasonably safe place. In any case, let us know the date on which the General Electric was surrendered, the name of the person to whom it was surrendered, and any other details that will enable us to trace it.


