Dear Madam:

With reference to your property at 352-370 Heatley Avenue and 701-707 East Hastings Street, you are aware of the difficulties experienced by Mr. Kozawko, to whom you originally rented this property and to whom also you sold the stock. We would advise that there have been many complicated points arising from the fact that the above was unable to carry out the original arrangements, and you are doubtless aware that Mr. Messenger, of Messrs H. D. Campbell who have been handling this matter, has made other arrangements with the new tenants, viz. Charlie Lim and Lim Lip Foon. For your information we enclose a copy of statement prepared by Mr. Messenger, which gives in detail the final arrangements made, and from which you will see that Mr. Kozawko has absorbed a total loss of \$75.29 in connection with the robbery which took place at these premises while same was in the hands of a caretaker after Mr. Kozawko had left. It was necessary for Mr. Messenger to put a caretaker in from the time Kozawko vacated, viz. the 12th of November until December 10th, when the Chinamen took over. The robbery occurred during the above period and while the caretaker was out to dinner one evening. The police of course were informed, but owing to the nature of the theft, viz. tobacco, cigarettes, etc., it has been impossible to recover any of the stolen stock.

In view of the fact that this theft occurred due to your own tenant falling down on the original arrangements made, it is only fair that you should bear a portion of the loss.

In view of the enclosed statement being so detailed, we do not propose to go at further length into this matter, but we think you will agree that same has been dealt with equitably.

We would here mention that the City of Vancouver Electrical Department has insisted on defective wiring being put in good condition, and also certain repairs to the roof of your building. This matter is being attended to immediately--details of the cost of this work will be forwarded to you at a later date.
