I have received your letter with the file number 3599. Please find enclosed four dollars in check (\$4.00) which I borrowed from my brother to make this payment. We have just sold his war saving certificate and received the check from Ottawa, for this is the only way I could make the payment. I am writing for my dad T. M. Digita, who is responsible with this. My dad is unable to pay for this at present because he is not working on the garden work in Vancouver, and the money he makes here will have to last us from November to next June for food, clothing and other necessary supplies. Dad says he'll pay the rest when he is back in Vancouver and continue his garden work. Otherwise he says he is unable to pay because of these circumstances. Please accept this small



payment for the damage he did on some else's.
