On Jan. 20/45, YAMAMOTO, through the B.C.S.C. claimed nets, lines and fishing equipment and chattels valued at \$1853.00, which in the opinion of Mr. H.F. Green, was quite ridiculous. No chattels were recovered from this shack and it is presumed they were either removed or sold by the above prior to his evacuation, or were stolen by fishermen after his departure. See Mr. Green's memo to file of March 2/43.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES:

According to information supplied to this office the above was the registered owner of a fishing vessel the "Y.Y.", which was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$254.90, and this sum was paid to the office of the Custodian and credited to the account of the above in this office. Full details are given on Specified Articles Summary on file.

SHACK OR FLOAT HOUSE:

Our agent, Mr. J. D. Mathers reported on April 20/42, that there was a float house owned by the above on the property of Mr. M. KOMORI, 318 River Road, Eburne. Mr. YAMAMOTO's family were still in occupation of this place at the time Mr. Mathers' report was made, YAMAMOTO being absent in one of the interior camps at the time. We wrote to Mr. Haruo KOMORI in March 18/43 asking him to confirm YAMAMOTO's ownership of this float house. YAMAMOTO was advised to make his own adjustment with KOMORI with regard to this house. (See administration Dept. letters of Sept. 12/45.

MONEY'S RECEIVABLE

When the files of Haruo and Fujimoto KOMORI are summarized and closed, attention should be given to the possible recovery of rent of the shack, and also the sale price of the shack if it was appraised before the property was sold.

VICTORY BOND:

The above declared one \$50.00 Victory Bond. This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

BANK ACCOUNT:

The above declared a savings account in the Bank of Montreal, Main and Hastings Sts., in the sum of \$50.00. This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

LIFE INSURANCE:

The above declared an insurance policy, #2222926 with the Sun Life Assurance Co. of Canada in the sum of \$1000.00. This did not come under the control of the Custodian. However on Jan. 12/46 YAMAMOTO

wrote and asked us to pay the premium on his policy with the Monarch Life Assurance Co., in the sum of \$42.25. This was paid by us on Jan. 26/46.

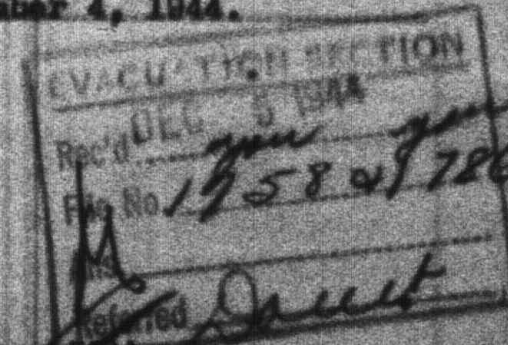

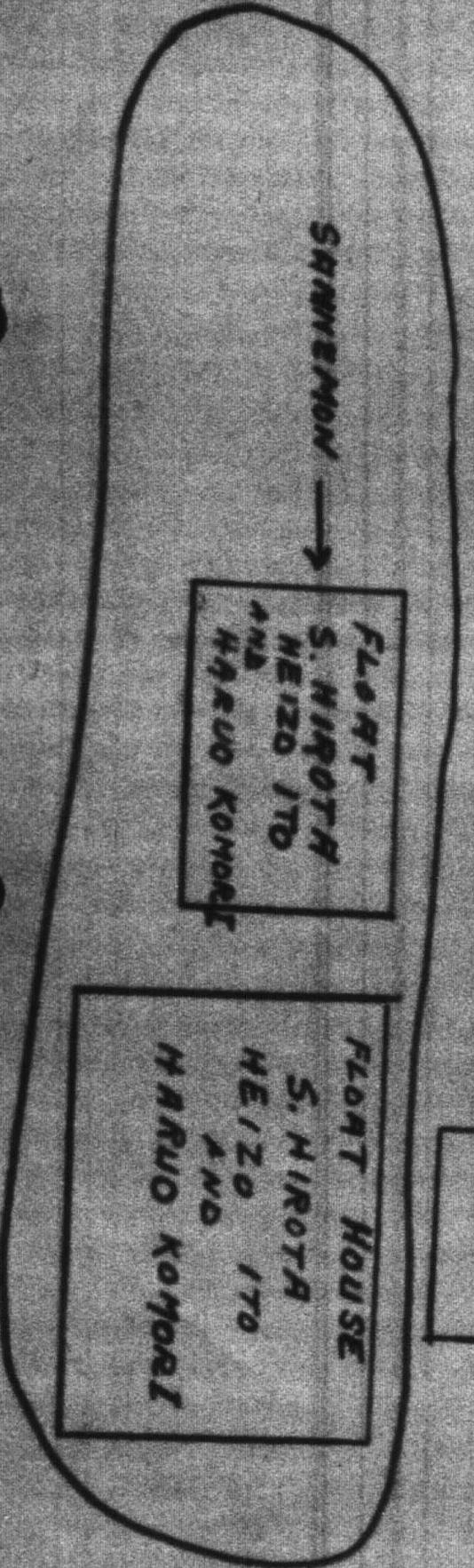

Thank you for yours of December 4th to which it will be difficult for us to give a full answer for a while.

This man owned a float house which was floated in on piles onto property belonging to Haruo Komori. It was, therefore, correct to say that he did not own any real property. At the same time this house, together with those of two other Japanese on this property, have been rented from November 1st, 1942 to date of sale of property, July 13th, 1944, for the sum of \$5.00 a month plus taxes.

The rental proceeds have been credited to the account of Haruo Komori pending a decision as to what ground rent if any will be charged to him. As the property has now been sold, it will similarly be necessary to determine how the proceeds of sale should be divided among the various parties. Our Administration Department have this in hand but it will be some little while yet, we fear, before a decision will be reached.

In a recent letter from the Welfare Manager, Mrs. E. Aruno, New Denver, to the Department of Labour, Japanese Division, Vancouver, reference is made to the fact that although you have written to the Kimori brothers at Taylor Lake, B. C., with a view to obtaining a settlement of the matter of your float house or shack, which was moored on or near the property owned by them at Harpole and which property was sold towards the end of last year, you have received no reply from them. We have, therefore, written fully to Haruo and Fujihiko Kimori pointing out to them that we understood when they visited this office some months ago that they would make a satisfactory settlement with you.

You will appreciate that as your dwelling rested on their land *legally* it might be very difficult for you to claim anything but as stated we have communicated with them and would suggest that you now write immediately to them, their full address being as follows:

You will recall that there was some misunderstanding with regard to the small float owned by Sojiro Uyeda. We are glad to say that this matter has been satisfactorily disposed of as it was found that this float was not included in the sale to the Canadian Fishing Company, and Mr. Uyeda has been credited with the net proceeds of the sale of his float so that this item is all clear. The only thing outstanding is the matter of your reimbursing Mr. Yamamoto.

Please note the rather formidable looking memo attached and at your convenience give us the following information. If necessary, the writer will accompany you after you have made a preliminary inspection:

1. Is our sketch correct.
2. Matsumasuke KOMORI, 318 River Road, R. R. No. 1, Eburne, B. C. Messrs. A. E. Austin report fishing nets, Diesel engine and gas engine as well as other effects on the premises rented by a Mr. Young. Please give whatever attention is necessary to this matter, if you think it wise removing the nets to Steveston for sale.
3. Hideo YAMADA. A small inventory including a Singer sewing machine and 800 corks was declared and I would like to know if these things are still there or if they were sold to Mr. Tommy Jones. You will see from the sketch that I am not quite clear which float has been sold.
4. Heizo ITO. I am not quite clear of the current position here but we have on file the following list of fishing equipment handed to us by Mr. Haruo KOMORI on August 4th:

It is now fairly definite that this is the correct name and we have now heard from the Tashme supervisor that this man has no interest in the float house which belongs to Heizo ITO, Mr. Carlson to whom we will shortly refer, is interested in renting this, and when I have your report and know exactly which house is where, I will write to Ito. Katsusaburo Fukunaga had a three-roomed house rented from Mr. Komori on the Riverside Road, Eburne, and our farm fieldmen recently took an inventory of these things. I am not sure if this house has yet been rented, but I think not.
7. Haruo KOMORI. There are the following points to be dealt with: you will see from Pages 1 and 2 of my memorandum that Carlson has rented this place and from Page 3 that he has moved to if some of

Katsusaburo FUKUNAGA's fishing equipment. Anything like this should be considered for removal to Steveston and sale. Carlson bought lumber for \$150.00 from Haruo KOMORI's father, Matsunosuke KOMORI, and claims he took it over as a favour and will pay for it when he uses it. I have since heard from Haruo KOMORI, however, with vehemence that he sold the lumber at half price and had Carlson's promise to pay \$75.00 on July 1st and \$75.00 on August 1st. While I had first thought Carlson a reliable person, Mr. Townsend seemed rather doubtful of this the other day and I would like you, if possible, to find out whether the lumber has actually been used, in which case we can insist on prompt payment.

Finally, you will see a reference on Page 3 of my memo to three shacks. These are on Lot one, Subsections 27, 28 and 29, Block 5N, Range 6W on the South Branch of the North Arm directly opposite the farm of Mr. Brown of Brooksbank Laboratories. I believe these have been already leased from the Soldier Settlement Board and if so, please let us know. If possible, include them in your sketch.

If you think this matter is too complicated for you to report on without more information, please make a preliminary inspection and then ask me to come along and assist in digging out all the information.

Thank you for yours of December 4th to which it will be difficult for us to give a full answer for a while.

This man owned a float house which was floated in on piles onto property belonging to Haruo Komori. It was, therefore, correct to say that he did not own any real property. At the same time this house, together with those of two other Japanese on this property, have been rented from November 1st, 1942 to date of sale of property, July 13th, 1944, for the sum of \$5.00 a month plus taxes.

The rental proceeds have been credited to the account of Haruo Komori pending a decision as to what ground rent if any will be charged by him. As the property has now been sold, it will similarly be necessary to determine how the proceeds of sale should be divided among the various parties. Our Administration Department have this in hand but it will be some little while yet, we fear, before a decision will be reached.

In answer to yours of the 22nd and enclosure from your Welfare Manager at New Denver, we have the following to report:

First of all this evacuee when he registered on April 10th, 1942, declared his effects only in general terms, his registration reading as follows:

"Stove (wood and coal), table, 2 chairs, kitchenware, sofa, 3 small tables, 6 chairs, 2 double beds, 4 fishing nets, 3 lines and hooks (each 150 fathoms)".

You will notice that no values are shown and that only four fishing nets were registered as against eight now claimed.

Our investigating agent visited the premises on April 20th after Mr. Yamamoto was evacuated and reported that his family were still on the property. His inventory made at the date of his visit only covered the barest necessities of life and made no reference to any fishing equipment.

Mrs. Yamamoto was not evacuated until July of 1942, at which time she declared no personal property, having doubtless disposed of all saleable items in the meanwhile. It is however only fair to mention that anything she might have left behind would have been stolen almost immediately since these buildings were ransacked by fishermen directly they were vacated. It does seem, however, that this family has really very little, if any, claim upon this Department.

The only outstanding matter would therefore be the division of rental proceeds and proceeds of sale of this man's shack between him and his landlords, the Kosori Brothers. These latter have been given

All information by our Administration Department and if they wish
to make any payment to the Kennecott they will doubtless do so.
They are not, of course, obligated to share rental or sale proceeds
with the Kennecott since the latter's deeds were created on their
land.
