PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File 3702

September 19, 1947.

Re: Henry Makiji MIYASAKA, Reg. No. 00839

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 10, 1942. His file does not reveal the date of his evacuation.

REAL ESTATE

Mr. Spain's memo of June 4, 1946, states that the lot referred to in the Form A sent to the Registrar at Vancouver on June 4, 1942, was owned by Harry Shigeichi MIYASAKA, Internee File 836, and the property is administered on that file.

CHATELS

On April 10, 1942, MIYASAKA signed a no property card. However, an additional registration was received from him on September 3, 1942, in which he declared several pieces of effects. The chattels in this file fall into three groups:

1. Chattels declared removed from 430 East Cordova Street to the home of Ralph YOSHIDA (File 6965) 22nd Road, Haney.
2. Chattels declared stored with Crone Storage
3. Undeclared chattels moved from 430 East Cordova St. (Anglican Mission) and sold in the name of Henry Makiji MIYASAKA.

1. Chattels at Haney

In his declaration of September 3rd, MIYASAKA reported two beds, four tables, kitchen utensils, chinaware, refrigerator, and a chest of drawers, moved from 430 E. Cordova, to the home of Ralph YOSHIDA, 22nd Road, Haney. (File 6965) Examination of YOSHIDA's file reveals that the house and property was owned by his father, Enzaburo YOSHIDA, File 6975. An inventory on file 6975, under date of October 6, 1942, states that the following articles were found at YOSHIDA's house marked "MIYASAKA": chest of drawers, end table and book rack, wash basin, large aluminum pot containing bowls and glass dishes, portable gramophone case, bundle of 12 table legs, several cartons containing clothing and dishes and a small round barrel.

On January 20, 1946, a letter was received from Enzaburo YOSHIDA stating that the two tables, table legs, refrigerator, bed and spring, and a can and sundries which had been sold at auction under his name were the property of Mr. M. H. MIYASAKA. Therefore, the net proceeds of the sale of these chattels - \$11.30 - was transferred from YOSHIDA's account to MIYASAKA's account and remitted to him on September 22, 1947

2. Chattels in Crone Storage

MIYASAKA reported on September 3, 1942, that two chests of tools and a three-piece chesterfield suite had been placed in Crone Storage. A letter from Crone Storage dated January 12, 1943, states that the suite was in storage under the name of Masu MIYASAKA, daughter of Henry Makiji MIYASAKA. The letter stated also that the tool chests had been delivered to Masu at Hastings Park on September 9, 1942.

On March 20, 1944, a letter was received from Crone's stating that in accordance with instructions received from Masu MIYASAKA, the suite was sold for \$50.00. (Letter on Masu's File, 7146) The storage charges of \$4.75 were deducted and a cheque for \$45.25 was enclosed. On March 31, 1944, we wrote to Masu advising her that we had received this cheque from Crone Storage and that the money had been credited to her account.



It was stated in the letter that although this chesterfield suite had been registered by her father, we had been advised by Crone Storage that all their dealings had been with her and we believed that there would be no objections to our sending the proceeds of sale to her. Mr. MIYASAKA wrote on April 11, 1944, requesting that the money be sent to his daughter, Masu. This amount was accordingly remitted to her on April 22, 1944.

3. Undeclared articles sold in the name of Henry Maskiji MIYASAKA

A large quantity of household goods and sundry items were sold under the name of MIYASAKA at Vancouver Auctions 59, 521, and 522, for the net sum of \$143.49. Mr. Spain's memo of December 14, 1944, states that these chattels had been removed from the Anglican Mission at 430 East Cordova Street, and had been identified by Reverend Gale, in whose charge they had been left. As MIYASAKA had stated specifically what he had transported to Haney and what had been placed in storage, and as he has never written regarding these additional chattels, the proceeds of the sales have been transferred to Chattel Suspense.

In accordance with Mr. Spain's memo of May 3, 1945, the sum of \$1.10 had been previously transferred from MIYASAKA's account to the account of Motozo TOYAMA, File 11186. The photography frames which he declared had been sold as a Developing Box under the name of MIYASAKA.

On December 15, 1942, Reverend W. H. MacWilliams called at the office and advised us that a Mr. MIYASAKA, had asked him to secure for him certain phonograph parts and bound copies of the New Canadian stored at 430 E. Cordova Street, together with other phonograph parts stored at 22nd Road, Haney, in the house previously occupied by Mr. Ralph YOSHIDA. From this information it would appear that the MIYASAKA who had made this request was Henry Makiji MIYASAKA, but Reverend MacWilliams was advised in letter of December 16, 1942, that in order that we could consider this request, to supply us with the first name of MIYASAKA, and if possible, his registration number. No reply was received and no further action was taken by this office.

This file reveals no other property.

Re: MIYASAKA

When you called at this office on December 15th, you advised us that a Mr. Miyasaka, presently residing in Three Valley, desired you to secure for him and to ship to him certain phonograph parts and bound copies of the New Canadian stored at 430 E Cordova Street, Vancouver, together with other phonograph parts said to be at 22nd Road, Haney, B. C., in the house previously occupied by a Mr. Ralph Yoshida.

In order that we may consider this request, kindly provide us with Mr. Miyasaka's full first Japanese name and if possible, with his Police Registration No., for which please accept our thanks in advance.

Generally speaking, and in confirming our telephone conversation with you of December 16th, we ask that you favour this office, when transmitting to us requests made of you by individuals of the Japanese race for release of personal possessions, by obtaining for us at such times their full Japanese names, their Police Registration Nos., their addresses in the Protected Area, together with a letter signed by said Japanese detailing particulars of chattels desired by them.

We might add in passing that a Mr. Henry Makiji Miyasaka, aged 55 years, who previously resided at 430 E Cordova Street, Vancouver, and who presently resides in Three Valley, B. C., declared to us on April 10th that he had no assets and no liabilities. Subsequently the same individual advised us that he had moved considerable furniture from 430 E Cordova Street to Haney and that he had removed other items from 430 E Cordova Street to Crone's Storage, Ltd., Vancouver.

I see from the Additional Registration of this Japanese that he left the undermentioned things at the house of Mr. R. T. Yoshida, 22nd Road, Haney:

2 beds  
2 large tables  
2 small tables  
kitchen utensils  
chinaware  
refrigerator machine  
1 chest-of-drawers

Reference to Mr. Yoshida's file, No. 6965, shows that the property is leased to a Mr. Murdock Beaton.

The key of the room where the chattels are stored is left with the Maple Ridge Cooperative Association at Haney.

This seems to be satisfactory storage, at least for the time being, and I am just sending you this memo so that the record may appear both on File No. 3702 and 6965.
