In regard to my brother Iwakichi Kitasaka, who is at present residing at No.267, Rosebery B. C. and who may be repatriated to Japan in the near future, I would be most obliged if you would kindly help me settle a money debt he owes me.

Dear Sir: We are in receipt of your rude and offensive letter of March 25, which we very much resent. We can only think that it was written through a sense of grievance and without thought. You must understand that there is no intention whatsoever of this office retaining funds when it is quite clear that they should be paid out. In this particular case, however, there were quite a number of matters about which we had to write to Mr. I. Kitasaka and as he was residing in an area under the control of the Department of Labour, they also had to be consulted in the matter. Everything is now quite clear, however, and in the course of the next two or three days you will be forwarded a cheque for \$80.00, being repayment of the loan made to your brother. Yours truly, P.
