I am trying to trace some goods I left behind at Fairview Buddhist Church - 713 W 7th Ave, at the time of evacuation. They were 3 large wooden boxes, containing glassware, crockery and clothes. One box contained all my carpentry goods. I wrote on these boxes only in Japanese but it had my registration number on them. I was assured this was all that was necessary by many people.

I hope you will do your best to find out about these goods, which to me, is of quite a value.

We are informed that you have made enquiries through our representatives now in Tashme regarding four boxes marked in Japanese said to have been left at the Fairview Buddhist Temple, Vancouver.

An examination of your file discloses the fact that when you registered at the office of the Custodian on April 10th, 1942, you declared no property of any description in the protected area.

An examination of the file of your wife however, declares some chattels left at 715 West 7th Avenue. We presume you seen these articles, and if so, we would advise you that these chattels have been sold at auction in the name of your wife for the net sum of \$6.99.

This place was ransacked by thieves regardless of special police protection and it is probable that your things were removed by thieves.

We regret having to forward such an unfavourable report but can do nothing under the circumstances.


Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:
