The Japanese declared it on April 14, 1942, and was not evacuated until June 5, 1942, so that he may have disposed of it in this interval. Personal effects appearing on an inventory of goods found at House No. 31, Phoenix Cannery, taken by J.D.Mather on June 2, 1942 are included in lists 64 and 56 on the file of Haru YAMAMOTO, wife of Heisaburo, File 2778. This woman declared many of these articles which have accordingly been dealt with as hers and proceeds of the sale credited to her account. Heizaburo declares no household goods. He declares a \$100.00 Victory Bond in his possession, also \*800.00 in Savings account #130 in the noyal Bank of Canada in Steveston. These were not brought under the control of the Custodian.
