With reference to your claim of \$3.00 against the above named Japanese. We have written to Mrs. YAMASHITA several times. The first time she replied saying she knew of no medical treatment received by herself or her family and asked for more information. We then supplied her with all the information with which you had supplied this office. She has made no reply to our latter letters. As the amount involved is small we feel that it would be better, in order to avoid unnecessary expense, if you were to deal with this party direct. If you decide to do so and she does not reply to your letters, it might be a good idea for you to ask the B. C. Security Commission to have their Supervisor in the Manitoba district contact her.
