There is no record of a boat belonging to this man, he was a minor at the time of his declaration and therefore could not legally own a boat, he did not declare a boat therefore it would appear that he did not own a boat or that it was sold by him or someone else on his behalf privately.

MEMORANDUM TO FILE 3900

May 26, 1944

Re Isamu MORI, Reg. 10742

Information from RCMP states, "Fisherman, Owner of boat."

The fishing vessel records do not show this man's name.

The Anglo-B. C. Packing Co. Ltd., in a list of vessels attached to their various canneries, showed the name

I. Mori, Fishing Licence 754, M/V "I. M."  
Attached to Good Hope Cannery. No debt to Company.

The Department of Fisheries report that Licence 754 was issued to Isgamu Nori. This name, no doubt, is that of Isamu MORI (somewhat garbled).

There is no record of the disposal of the "I.M."

Isamu MORI was a minor, and could not legally be the licensed owner of a vessel.

Isamu MORI, according to his file, was employed by British Columbia Packers Ltd.

Isamu MORI did not declare ownership of a vessel. Which would indicate that he did not own a boat, or that the vessel was sold by him (or by someone acting on his behalf) privately.

On the list of vessels attached to your canneries, which you supplied to the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee, the fishing vessel "I.M." Fishing Licence 754, owned by I. Mori, is shown as being attached to Good Hope Cannery, Rivers Inlet; with the further information that there was no mortgage held by your company and that the boat-owner was not indebted to your company.

This vessel was not among those surrendered to the authorities.

Although Isamu MORI declared ownership of this vessel, there is no record of his having sold the vessel.

As this vessel was attached to your Good Hope Cannery, it is possible that you can supply information that will enable us to trace this vessel.

The Custodian requests this information by virtue of the powers granted him under Revised Regulations Respecting Trading with the Enemy (P.C.8526), Section 20.

Your kind attention to our request will be appreciated.


