PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

This woman, who was evacuated on September 8, 1942, signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 17, 1942.

In her declaration she reported 20 items of personal and household effects left in Cumberland. Of these a bed and two mattresses were discarded as valueless; a stove was sold by the owner and payment made to her husband direct by the purchaser; two beds and some blinds were sold by the Custodian for the net sum of \$3.56, which has been credited to the account of Mrs. NISHIMURA; and the balance of her chattels were taken away at the time of evacuation or were shipped to the family later in 1942.

Mrs. NISHIMURA declared, left in Safety Deposit Box, at Royal Bank of Canada, Cumberland, \$200.00 in Victory Bonds and \$55.00 in War Savings Certificates. These did not come under the control of the Custodian.

A joint bank account (Nobusuke & Take NISHIMURA) Royal Bank of Canada, Cumberland, \$1,900.00. This did not come under the control of this office.

Mrs. NISHIMURA declared two life policies on her husband's life: Policy No. 887,683 - \$1,000.00 and Policy No. 887,701 - \$1,000.00, both apparently with the Sun Life Assurance Co. of Canada. These did not come under the control of this office.

A Safety Deposit Box at the Royal Bank of Canada (No. probably 22) was declared. This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

This file reveals no other property, real or personal.

The file of Nobusuke NISHIMURA, husband of Take, File 12047, has been reviewed and closed.

In her declaration of April 17, 1942, this woman reported ownership of a large quantity of personal and household effects left at the Cumberland Storage Co. and at Royston Lumber Co., Cumberland.

These chattels were tagged and numbered, and there were, in all, 20 different units; i.e., boxes, sewing machine, stove, etc. These have been accounted for as follows:

No. 7, a box of books, was taken by the family.

Nos. 10 and 19, bed posts and springs, and two mattresses, respectively, were discarded as valueless.

No. 20, a stove, was sold as arranged by Nobusuke NISHIMURA, husband of Take, and the proceeds, \$12.00, was sent to him direct to Tachwa. The Custodian had nothing to do with this sale.

Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 11, 12, 14, 16, 17 & 18 were shipped to the owner in 1942.

Nos. 13 and 15, bed posts and springs, together with some blinds, were sold at auction by the Custodian on February 21, 1945, and the account of Take NISHIMURA has been credited with the net proceeds, in the amount of \$3.56.

Dear Madam:

Attached is Custodian cheque in the amount of \$3.56, representing all the funds standing to your credit with this office.

In your declaration to the Custodian, you reported a quantity of personal and household effects left by you at Cumberland, B. C. The greater part of these chattels were shipped to you in 1942. A box of books was taken with you upon your evacuation. A stove was, according to information given to us, sold by your husband for the sum of \$12.00, which was sent to him at Tashme. Two mattresses and a bed were found to be of no value. Two beds and some blinds were sold by the Custodian for the net sum of \$3.56, which was credited to your account.

You declared Victory Bonds and War Savings Certificates, a bank account, a safety deposit box and two life insurance policies (on your husband's life). None of these items came under the control of the Custodian.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and, in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the attached cheque, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
