On September 16, 1942, the Oustedian sold a vessel, which is described in the sales paper as, "T.K."(Y.O.) Her Westminster Licence 2331, being 30' x  $7^{1}2^{1}x3^{1}$ , with Palmer 6 HP engine. The vessel sold carried Haval Control No. HW.084-H and the initials and numbers "T.K.768".

Mayel Control No. IW.084-R was issued to S. Inouye. Shinkichi INOUTE, Theny File 1431, the left Vancouver on the Hikawa Maru on Revenber 1, 1941, but was steping from that ship on her arrival at Seattle, and who is believed to have drowned, was licensed owner of a vessel, "S.I." Licence No. Victoria 2331.

The vessel MS.I." Victoria No. 2331, was transferred by INCUYE to Yasayama CYE, who had the vessel re-licensed in his own name under Vancouver License No. 6603.

According to sales paper in the possession of Toshikasu KOYAMA, File 6829, the vessel licensed Vencouver Bo. 6603, was purchased by KOYAMA from Taxograma OIS on December 1, 1941.

As Shinkichi INCOYE had been given permission by the Foreign Exchange Control Board to leave Canada on the understanding that he would not transfer any assets he might have in Canada prior to his leaving, the transfer of this vessel to OTE was not recognized by the Custodian, and the net proceeds of the sale have been held in blocked account.

However, the Custodian now takes the stand that as this vessel was licensed in the name of Tasoyama OTE at the outbreak of war with Japan and at the time she came under the control of the Custodian, the registered title of Tasoyama OTE is recognised, and any paper giving acceptable proof that OTE had sold this vessel to Toshikasu KOYAMA will enable this office to transfer to the account of KOYAMA the net proceeds from the sale of the vessel.
