GENERAL SUMMARY

Re: Mitsue (Mrs. Koshiro) Aoyama, #61495

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 15, 1942 in which she reported that she owned no property of any kind in the protected area.

However, on October 1, 1942 the Singer Sewing Machine Co., Vancouver, informed us that they were storing a sewing machine belonging to this woman, on which a balance of \$14.00 was outstanding. This balance was paid off by March 11, 1942 and the machine released to her.

The R.C.M.P. handed to this office a Kodak camera and a Philco mental radio. The camera is still on hand and the radio was sold through this office and the amount of \$14.30 credited to the account of this woman. We have written to her for these receipts but to date have received no reply.

DECLARATION AS TO LOSS OF RADIO & CAMERA RECEIPTS

CANADA )  
PROVINCE OF ONTARIO )  
TO WIT: )

IN THE MATTER OF a receipt for radio and camera  
owned by Mitsue AOYAMA, formerly of 1645 West  
Broadway, Vancouver, British Columbia.

I, Mitsue AOYAMA, housewife, formerly of 1645 West Broadway, Vancouver,  
B. C. now a resident of Toronto, Ontario, do solemnly declare:

1. That I owned a Philco mantel radio, serial number P1024, and an Eastman Kodak camera, All6, Serial 452947, and have personal knowledge of the facts herein declared.
2. That I had in my possession and control at 1645 West Broadway Avenue, the radio described above, and on the 17th day of March, 1942, I delivered said radio to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and obtained a receipt therefor.
3. That I had in my possession and control at 1645 West Broadway Avenue, Vancouver, B. C. the camera described above, and on the 22nd day of September, 1942 I delivered the said camera to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and obtained a receipt therefor.
4. That I have made a most diligent search for the said receipts in all repositories where such receipts might be. I have not found the same and I verily believe that the said receipts have been lost beyond recovery or destroyed.
5. That I have not in any way dealt with the said receipts or papers relating to the said radio and camera and have not pledged or hypothecated the same or lodged the receipts with any person, firm or corporation as security.
6. That the sole reason for the non-production of the receipts is that these have been lost or accidentally destroyed.
7. That I have been informed that my radio has been sold for the net sum of \$14.80 and that my camera is in the possession of the Custodian.
8. That I, Mitsue AOYAMA, the owner, am therefore entitled to the proceeds of the sale of my radio, amounting to \$14.80.
9. That I, Mitsue AOYAMA, the owner, am entitled to receive my camera.

AND I make this solemn declaration, conscientiously believing it to be true and knowing that it is of the same force and effect as if made under oath and by virtue of the Canada Evidence Act.
